# Tauranga International

December 30th saw a crowd of over 20,000 at the Bay Park Raceway for the 1st Rothman's International Motor Race.

The programme was for 12 Races, 10 car and 2 motorcycle. The first race was for the bikes, and as usual nobody could tell who was leading after the first lap.

Race two was 0-1000 Group 5 Saloons with Rodger Anderson and his Cooper S on pole position. At flag fall Rodger gained a narrow lead over Roy Harrington in the familiar Yellow Imp. These two had a good fight for first place for several laps before Harrington retired; some distance back Ron Brown, Rod Collingwood and Kevin Clark were scrapping for the minor placings; these finally going to Brown and Collingwood.

Event three was for Sports Cars up to 1500cc. Grant Bloore was undoubtably the star of this race with the old bobtail cooper keeping the Mk. 1 Heron at bay until he spun on Rothmans Curve with two laps to go and Baron Robertson took the lead with Ross West's Lotus Super 7 second and Ian Morrison in his U2 third.

Race four was the first preliminary for the Bay Park Championship. All the starters for this race were under 1500cc. Greame Lawrence was running with fuel injection which did not give him enough power to hold Lawrence Brownlie.

The start of this race was marred by the shunt which sent Graham Harvey to hospital with a broken leg and bruising and forced the withdrawal of Tim Bailey and Ken Smith. The race was hard fought by Brownlie but he was just to hard for Lawrence to catch, third was Roly Levis driving his old car which he had sold to Tony Shaw.

Race Five 1001-1300 Group 5. This was a two car battle between Bryan Harvie and Hugh Kettlewell in the Austin and Morris Cooper "S's" Kettlewell was slipstreaming all the way up the back straight pulling out just before the corner and making a break, but seemed to be having trouble with his 5 speed gearbox; then on the last corner of the last lap Kettlewell got through to lead Harvie by about a cars length past the flag. Murray Lucas in his fuel injected Anglia was third.

Event 6 over 1300 Saloons and the first N.Z. appearance of Stormin Norman Beechey with his immaculate Chevy Nova. This had the promise of being a good race, 4 Mustangs, 1 Fairlane and the Chevy. Beechey snatched the lead at the start with Fahey in close attendance leaving stand corner which brings the cars into the short front straight, Fahey outdragged the Chevy and led for a short while, back infield there was a tremendous dice going on between Bryan, Dawson and Coppins all on Mustangs and Francevic in the Fairlane. Lap three saw the Fairlane retire and Dawson make a determined effort to catch the leaders then the crowd realised that the Bryan Mustang had rushed through the field from about 5th to 3rd right onto the tail of Fahey and had pulled out a lead over Dawson and Coppins, this was the order they

finished.

Event Seven the second Preliminary and the over 1500 Single Seaters faced the starter. Dawson led away from the start in the 2.5 Brabham and Jimmy Palmer stalled on the line in front of Lawrence Brownlie who was starting from the rear of the grid. Dawson built up a good lead over Vince Anderson and Brian Faloon, both in 2.5 Brabhams until Faloon went straight ahead at the Beazley Homes Corner and poked the Brabham's nose through the fence doing minor suspension damage to the car. The race ran out its distance with Dawson first, Anderson second, and Tony Batchelor third.

Race eight and it was the big banger Sports Cars, Andy Buchanan ran away with this race, to win from Johnny Riley in his Lotus - Olds-mobile and Ron Rutherford in the small Lotus 23B with an 1800 engine.

Race nine was bikes and utter confusion again, then back to the racing again with Race ten which was an Invitation race for sports and sports racing cars. This race also went to Andy Buchanan after Brent Hawes slammed into the fence at Beazley Homes Corner and Johnny Riley just not quite making the finish in the Lotus-Olds which had been leaving a long cloud of smoke over the circuit for most of the race. Ron Rutherford in the 23B retired with a suspect gearbox and so second place went to J. Armstrong driving a Lotus 11 Climax and third went to Baron Robertson in the Heron Mk.1.

Race Eleven the Bay Park Championship for Single Seaters this time Palmer made no mistakes about who was going to win, although he was followed very closely by Lawrence Brownlie for a good part of the race but Brownlie lost a lot of ground when baulked by slower cars, Graene Lawrence was third with Roly Levis fourth.

Race twelve promised to be a good one; Invitation Saloons and with Prize-money of \$200 first, \$100 second, \$80 third and \$60 fourth. Beechy and Fahey were away first with Bryan, Dawson and Coppins in close attendance. Dawson is a treat to watch the way he just sits there and throws his Mustang around, he and Beechey were very similar in their cornering. Frank Bryan confounded all his critics by constantly being ahead of Coppins and Dawson and at most times was snapping at Fahey's tail, and would have finished closer but for a spin at Beazleys. Dawson made a good effort to really get amongst them but the car gave a big puff of smoke and coasted to a halt. The race ran out with another win for Beechey, Fahey second and Bryan third.

After Race twelve there was a race for formula Vee's; this was not on the programme but was run off to show the public what F.V. is all about. Unfortunately not even the commentator had a list of entrants so there was no way of telling who was who except they kept on saying they had a lady driver Joan Berry when in fact it was Ivan Berry an Australian who has a Vee based on an Elfin Vee.

Generally speaking the meeting was lacking in many departments, the morning races started on time but so much time had been allowed between races that there was often gaps of twenty minutes until the next race was due to start. This problem was aggravated when just before the first big saloon race there was a twenty minute gap while the officials waited for the starting time during which cement was laid on the bleed-

ing track surface, then after a warm-up lap the drivers asked for the Rothmans Curve to be swept as the clouds of dust brought visability down to nil, this created a further delay of an hour by which time the spectators were getting restless.

The experience of running another couple of meetings will no doubt improve this situation and the Promoters are to be congratulated for bringing a driver of Norm Beechey's Calibre to New Zealand. It's a pity we couldn't have seen him on a faster circuit like Pukekohe. If it hadn't been for Stormin Normin, the one hour twenty minute wait would have been inexcusable. He's just that good he was well worth waiting for.



#### CLUB CIRCUIT

The first Club Circuit Meeting of the year got under way on Sunday (why weren't you at church) 28th January, in fine warm weather. After the usual <u>friendly</u> talk from the Clerk of the Course (better known to some of us as Friendly Les) practice and racing started.

Good racing was had by all and in the Baby Car Class Ron Brown, Alan (Tomato Turned Lavender) Boyle and Rod Collingwood all provided some very clean and close racing. Standard Production (not Wills Trim) cars were a bit low on entries but didn't lack flavour, what with Graeme Morley in his Fliat 1500 doing a rather neatly executed spin and fell into a ditch, only thing dented was his pride I think. (Did you get your hand smacked Graeme). An interesting car racing was the latest Crossflow Headed Cortina of Ted Lees (a good Wills car methinks). Other notables of the day were Ted Thompson in his Mini-Ford, or was it Fomi, a real flyer this car, it even had the starter etc. running away from it.

Sporty cars saw Jim Boyd in the Lycoming having a game of tag with J. Mahon in his 1275 M.G. Midget. Following them was Ty Hartnett in his Ford 1500 powered Morgan (wait till he hots it up) who seemed to be venturing to greener pastures at various times during the day. Behind Hartnett came Martin Compton in his M.G.B. who drove very steadily, waited for others to make the errors.

Next in line were the single seaters, comprising a mixture of Formula "V"s (horizontally opposed mass suicide) motor cycle motor varient cars, Coopers, Japs, Triumphs, Nortons. The first race promissed to be a bit of a thriller. A good start saw Peter Bruin (alias Rollover Bruin) lead the pack of "V"s and Coopers etc. Meanwhile, back in the field Ross Hollings who had a starting line shunt with Norm Dobson in his Norton MK 1 (Norm actually stalled and Ross' shunt restarted him) was working his way thru the field in fine style in the Mini-Max and Lap Two saw Barry Munro try to outbrake the pack and lose it completely in the middle of the Hairpin. Hollings then took the remaining cars and went on to an impressive lead coming near to lapping the tail enders.


