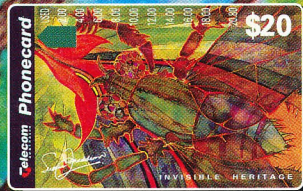

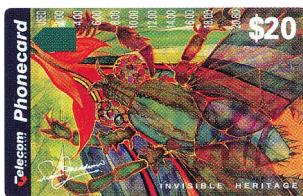
## Invisible Heritage

## OFFICIAL ISSUES

Available through the March issue of the *Bulletin* is the Invisible Heritage series. The three cards in this series feature the extraordinary work of Sue Maddern, an Australian artist and designer. Her work combines graphic realism with expressionist abstraction in a continuing series about insects in their natural surroundings. Sue uses a Zeiss microscope with a fitted camera to study the insect so she is able to translate considerable detail into her work. Her unique and unusual paintings, which feature exclusively on this **Phonecard** series, depict three Australian insects; the Richmond Birdwing Butterfly on the \$5 card, the Blue Tiger Butterfly on the \$10 card and the Bushfly on the \$20 card. All of the insects which appear on these cards were found around Terania Creek, in the Northern Rivers area of NSW.

The Richmond Birdwing is one of the largest butterflies in Australia, and has been described by naturalists as “the largest, most perfect and most beautiful of butterflies”. In the Northern Rivers area, the existence of the Richmond Birdwing is under threat and a support group has been formed to protect it from extinction. The Blue Tiger butterfly is a powerful flyer, and has been spotted up to 50km off the shore of Townsville. Indeed it is not uncommon to find this species well distributed in the Pacific Islands, including Fiji, Tonga, Samoa and New Zealand. The painting of the Bushfly represents the artists initial awareness of the beauty of insects. The fly was buzzing around, disturbing her while she was trying to paint. “I caught it and studied it and painted it using a small magnifying lens, so the detail is not as exacting as my work with insects, which has developed over the years.”

The Invisible Heritage series and Limited Edition folder are available for sale for \$45.50 through the March issue of the *Bulletin*.

## ADVERTISING CARDS

The final card in the popular Book Muncher series, the \$20 card, went out through the shops from late February and is available for sale through this issue of the *Bulletin*. This card has proved extremely popular with collectors of all ages, but particularly with junior collectors. The fact that this series is an advertising series, with national distribution and a high print run makes it particularly appealing since used cards can be easily obtained through payphone disposal boxes.

Roam Pacific, a company that has previously only issued Custom cards, are releasing an Advertising **Phonecard** to mark the 50th Anniversary of the end of WWII. There



will be 100,000 \$5 cards released through general distribution. This design will also be released by Roam Pacific as part of a Custom card series containing four \$2 cards. The \$5 Advertising card was released through the shops in February and is available for sale in this issue of the *Bulletin*.

Another company that has previously only released Custom cards, the Beagle Bros, have produced 10,000 \$5 Advertising cards featuring the Skyfire. This design will also be released as both an Advertising and Custom card. The Advertising card will be available through shops in the ACT only, and is available in this issue of the Bulletin.

The \$10 Advertising card marking the 100th anniversary of the Banjo Paterson's Waltzing Matilda will be available through the shops from March and is available in this issue of the Bulletin. There are 50,000 Advertising cards being produced.

## **UPCOMING ISSUES**

To mark the 50th year since the end of WWII, Telecom is releasing an official issue of three cards to commemorate this historic occasion. The series comprises a \$5, \$10 and \$20 card and honours those that served in WWII and those who stayed at home to keep the nation running. This series will be available for sale in the May issue of the *Bulletin*.

This is an official issue series and should not be confused with the Custom Card series being released by Roam Pacific featuring the same theme. There are four \$2 cards and one \$5 card in the Roam Pacific Custom Card series, and the \$5 card, showing the War Memorial in Canberra, will also be released as a general Advertising card. The \$5 card is available for sale through this issue of the *Bulletin*.

## **GIFT FOR COLLECTORS**

A series of advertising cards promoting payphone usage will be released in April. The series, featuring pop art style cartoons, includes three cards – \$5, \$10 and \$20 – which will be released nationally through the usual outlets, and a special \$2 card. The \$2 card will be sent out as a refund card and will also be used as a general promotional card. The **Phonecard** Collector Service will package this \$2 **Phonecard** into a specially designed gift card, similar to the \$1.50 Christmas card, and given to Collectors as a gift when they purchase the \$5, \$10 and \$20 cards in the series. There will be a limited number of these packaged cards produced and they will only be available as gifts to collectors, and will not be available for sale or otherwise through any other outlet. This series will be available through the May issue of the *Bulletin*.



## ROYAL EASTER SHOW, SYDNEY

The Pop Art series of Advertising cards will be on sale at the **Phonecard** stand at the Royal Easter Show. The **Phonecard** stand is aimed at promoting **Phonecard** understanding and usage within the general public. There will also be a section on **Phonecard** collecting, manned by the Collector Service's staff. Come and meet the staff, see the display and purchase your exclusive **Phonecard** T-shirt, with a free \$2 **Phonecard**, in the Entertainment and Education Pavilion at the Easter Show.

## STANDING ORDERS

Please note: if you have an existing Standing Order Arrangement that you wish to either cancel or change (order either more or less cards and folders), this request must be received in writing. If you wish to change an existing account, that account will have to be closed, and a new account with the altered details will be opened. The **Phonecard** Collector Service will require six (6) weeks notice for any alterations or cancellations to take effect prior to the release of the next issue. Thus, if you cancel an SOA and a new issue is due out within the next six weeks, you will still receive and be charged for this release.

## ALBUMS

There is a limited supply of the original Official Telecom Albums, featuring the old Telecom logo, still left in stock. When these are sold out, they will not be reproduced, so this is the last opportunity for Collectors to secure an important part of **Phonecard** history. The albums are available for sale at \$40 through the PCS. Included with the Album are five 10 pocket sleeves, five Limited Edition folder sleeves and five page dividers. Please place orders for this product in writing.

## JOINT PROMOTION PRODUCT

As advised in the January issue of the *Bulletin*, the Special Issue Joint Promotion Product commemorating the 100th anniversary of Banjo Paterson's "Waltzing Matilda" is now available for sale. This exciting new release is the first time an official issue of Telecom **Phonecard** has been packaged with another product and it is bound to become a sought after piece of **Phonecard** history, commemorating an important part of Australian history.

The issue is made up of a total of 5,000 Portfolios in two distinct options available only through a specially conducted Ballot application:

**Premium Portfolio**, \$195 each    1,000 – Telecom has 500 available for sale

#### HOW TO APPLY

- 1) Enclosed with your March *Bulletin*, you will find special Ballot application forms. Please use only these forms when ordering the **Waltzing Matilda Portfolios**. Any orders for cards other than the **Waltzing Matilda Portfolios** that are placed on this application form will **not** be processed, including the Waltzing Matilda Advertising card.
- 2) Please use only the appropriate self addressed envelopes supplied with this month's *Bulletin* – these require a stamp to be posted.
- 3) Use the envelope addressed in orange to apply for the **Premium Portfolio** and the envelope addressed in blue for the **Deluxe Portfolio**. Any ballot applications that are not sent in these envelopes **WILL NOT QUALIFY FOR THE BALLOT DRAW**. If you have not received either or both of the correct envelopes and you wish to apply for the Waltzing Matilda Portfolios, contact (02) 204 0255 and they will be sent to you by express post.
- 4) Do not send payment by cheque or money order. Ensure that you supply a day time contact number, and those who have been successful in the Ballot will be contacted by phone and asked to send in a cheque or money order for the appropriate amount.
- 5) Collectors who wish to pay for either the **Deluxe** or **Premium Portfolio's** by credit card will be able to include their credit card details on the application form.
- 6) All unsuccessful applications for the Ballot will be destroyed unopened, and therefore any cheques or money orders will be destroyed.

The packaged cards in both the **Premium** and **Deluxe Portfolios** will carry the **S Code**. In addition, there will be 50,000 Advertising cards produced (not 100,000 as previously advised in the January issue of the *Bulletin*), which will feature the Waltzing Matilda design and will be released unpackaged through the shops. These cards are available for sale at their face value in this issue of the *Bulletin*.

The very first **Premium Portfolio** – with matching red serial numbers of 000000 – is being donated by Telecom Australia and Note Printing Australia to be auctioned by Spinx Noble at 2.30 pm on 30 March and the money raised will be donated to the Retarded Children Centre. Zillah plays an active role in many areas of community life. She aided the establishment of the La Trobe branch of St Vincent de Paul, helped initiate Meals on Wheels in the district and spends much of her time fundraising for the Football Club and Catholic Church.

#### JENNY BUTT, FROM ACT

On discovering that Canberra lacked an organisation to help the drought victims of Queensland and NSW, Jenny organised to collect supplies through supermarkets, shopping centres and other public places and organised a transport system to send supplies to severely affected areas. Jenny has currently sent more than 11,000 parcels of food, toys and necessities to severely affected areas.

**MAURICE CORCORAN, FROM SOUTH AUSTRALIA**

Maurice has worked as a social worker in the area of disability and has set up an advocacy for disability rights and equity. He was instrumental in bringing about a national strategy for disability access for transport.

**MAUREEN MACEY, FROM QUEENSLAND**

Maureen has been the administrator of the Blue Nursing Home in Labrador for the past 13 years, but her dedication to the elderly in the community goes well beyond her working life. Maureen has become family for many of the old people, visiting them on Christmas Day and other special occasions.

**COLIN JAMES, FROM VICTORIA**

Colin has been confined to a wheelchair since he was four with a crippling arthritic disorder. He has spent many years fundraising and entertaining at senior citizens clubs. Colin assists disabled people in a work-training environment and is presently writing a travel guide for people confined to wheelchairs who find it difficult to find suitable accommodation and gain entry into tourist attractions.

**FREDERICK FRANK, FROM WESTERN AUSTRALIA**

Fred is a project manager for the Council of the Aging. His work involves convening conferences on the needs of the elderly and establishing community based programmes. He initiated the Senior Volunteer programme which couples retired or elderly people in the community with high school students who have literacy problems.

**PHILLYS CASCUN HANNAH, FROM NSW**

Phyllis has contributed to and raised money for many charities, including the Kidney Foundation and Camp Quality, through car rallying.

**CAROLYN MURRELL, FROM THE NORTHERN TERRITORY**

Carolyn has worked tirelessly since 1976 for the blind and vision impaired people in the Northern Territory. She was the founding member of the NT Association for the Blind and Vision impaired in 1978, and at present is Vice-President of the NT Blind Association and Vice-President of the Australian Blind Sports Association. She constantly lobbies for disabled sport in Australia and helps vision-impaired people on a daily basis.
