





EDITORIAL

Some normality returned last month, particularly towards the end of it, as the demand for advertising space as requested by dealers and card producers, eased somewhat.

Whilst an excellent cross section of adverts from which to choose items of interest are still contained in the magazine, this issue allowed me to 'catch up' with some articles on areas of both relevance to the current collecting scene as well as on general interest.

Interst in phonecards continues to grow at a steady rate as is evidenced by some recent developments. More and more Stamp and Coin dealers are entering the scene as can be seen by recent advertisers to this magazine, whilst other individuals are exhibiting their faith in the hobby by committing themselves fully to it. Don and Barbara Hill of Knox-Sherbrooke Phonecards from Melbourne are such an example.

Don was one of the first to see the potential of this new hobby and made the conversion from collector to part-time dealer in November, 1992. Since then, the business has developed so much that first Barbara (one year ago), and now Don, have given up their 'day jobs' to concentrate full time on the venture. Don states that he is very confident of the future in phonecards and is more than happy to leave his teaching position on December 9 this month.

But for a commitment to year 12 students taking exams, Don says he would have left teaching six months ago and has had to compensate for this by working till midnight many nights of late. I hope they can catch up on their sleep after mid December - I know exactly how they feel!

Along the same lines, I am negotiating at present with a choice of distributors in relation to this magazine being available from newsagencies nationally. It is still proposed that this commence with the January issue. The placement of a monthly phonecard magazine into newsagencies can only help foster both the hobby aspect of phonecard collecting as well as the business side of phonecard production and selling/reselling.

To assist me to ascertain the direction that the magazine takes, I have inserted a Questionaire in this issue and I ask that you take some time to complete it and return it to me.

Whilst the magazine has been produced solely by myself to date, changes are about to take place and your answers to the questions posed, as well as comments and constructive criticisms are sought, as they will influence the content and hopefully the quality of the magazine.

As an incentive to complete the Questionaire, one hundred (100) of the APMs \$2 Complimentary Phonecards will be issued to the first one hundred Questionaires returned.

Whilst the form has no provision for your name to be included - people can remain anonymous if they wish - those that wish to be in the draw, need simply put their name on the back of the envelope containing the Questionaire.

Sydney to Hobart Yacht Race

In a number of conversations that I have had recently with Graham Rooke from PayTel he has indicated that he is extremely proud that his company have been chosen by Kodak Australasia to produce a set of phonecards which commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Sydney to Hobart yacht race.

The card set and associated collector's pack have now been designed and approved by Kodak and will be available to collectors for a limited time only, from mid December to the end of January, 1995. Each card and the associated pack bears the official Kodak Gold race logo and the statement "Official product made under exclusive license, Kodak Gold Sydney to Hobart Yacht Race 1994".

The card set offers four unique cards (2 x \$5, 1 x \$10 and 1 x \$20) featuring magnificent action photographs by acclaimed yacht race photographers, Richard Bennett of Tasmania and David Clare of Sydney. Image treatment, utilising the latest computer graphics techniques have combined these action shots into a truly unique set of cards which convey the true spirit of man against the tempest of the sea.

These PayTel phonecards are printed on plastic - a new departure for PayTel - to present the images at their very best. An Australian first is that all cards are printed in five colours - the fifth colour being gold. Readers will note that this fifth colour has been utilised on the cover of this magazine - also a first. Cards are available separately or as a set at face value (\$40.00 per set) plus a small postage charge.

To complete the presentation, a limited edition numbered commemorative pack has also been designed. This eight face, A4 size pack is a PayTel "Special" designed to present the yacht race card set in the most handsome of formats. Printed in full colour with spot varnish to enhance the quality of the photographs, the pack features the Kodak Gold winner's cup in gold on the cover and the additional large photographs by Richard Bennett and David Clare. The history of the Sydney to Hobart race is provided in the pack, from the first race in 1945. Historical information in the form of maps and pictures from the original Rani log to the list of 49 winners.

This presentation is designed to truly commemorate the 50th anniversary of this world famous event - Australia's own ocean racing classic. The commemorative pack, complete with a full set of phonecards is available for \$47.50, plus a small postage fee.

Graham advises that it is anticipated that up to 5,000 packs will be sold during the limited sales period. Any packs not sold by 31st January, 1995, will be destroyed and collectors will be advised in the February issue of *The PayTel Collector*, the actual number of packs sold.

Packs and cards will be available to collectors direct from PayTel or from their favourite dealer from mid December. Advance orders are now being accepted. Issue 4 of *The PayTel Collector* will be posted on the 8th of December and will feature a full colour presentation of the cards, together with the story of their design. A special collectors' yacht race order form will be enclosed.

Further information re PayTel's 'plans' for 1995 are included in the Australian Update section - Ed.

Sydney to Hobart - 50th Anniversary Festival Whilst it will be possible to obtain the cards and packs as indicated above, those that may be in Hobart for the 'end of the race' festivities will be able to purchase these cards and packs, as well as other PayTel products from a stall to be set up by John Howell from Hobart's Abacus Phonecards, at Elizabeth Street Pier, within three metres of the Yacht Marina.

The Sydney to Hobart 50th Anniversary Festival runs from the 28th of December to the 4th of January inclusive, from 9.00am to 11.00pm each day.

John and his staff will be there during this time. He is looking forward to meeting existing mainland clients, as well as local ones.





AUSTRALIAN NEWS UPDATE

TELECOM AUSTRALIA

As previewed in the last issue of APM, Telecom Australia has officially informed of a change in policy regarding print sizes and pricing of the various denominations of Custom Phonecards.

Essentially, the major changes are to the \$2.00 denomination. The minimum print size has been increased from 10,000 to 25,000. The \$2.00 Phonecard was reintroduced to the product range at the launch of Phonecard Advertising in December, 1993, to be used as a promotional give-away item. However, the majority of orders have been for collectable purposes. Therefore, the decision has been made to increase the print size. In an effort to encourage clients to use the \$2.00 Phonecard as a premium item, the pricing has been adjusted also.

From 1 January, 1995, all \$2.00 Phonecards must have printed the words 'Complimentary Only' on them.

Following, are the revised price schedules indicating the minimim print sizes as well as the prices per denomination that apply as from 1 January, 1995.

FIVE YEAR BIRTHDAY PHONECARD

Telecom has released a \$5 card to commemorate five years of Phonecard in Australia. Featured in last

month's suppliment, the Phonecard features one of Australia's best known national emblems, the 'cockie', sporting five birthday candles on its plumage.

In the five years since a telephone card system was introduced in Australia, Phonecard collecting has become one of the fastest growing hobbies in the country. With more than 24,000 people registered with the Phonecard Collector Service and 1,200 new members joining every month, Phonecard has become an equivalent collectable to stamps and coins.

Phonecard was first trialed in Australia in the Geelong area in late 1989. This first official issue has become known as the 'Geelong issue' and features graphics from Australia's Royal Life Saving Society and Surf Life Saving Association.

Following the success of the Geelong trial, Phonecard was launched progressively throughout Australia over the next 18 months. Phonecard has been available nationally since November 1991.

Inspiration for the huge growth in collecting has come partly from the specially designed Limited Edition folders which provide an easy and attractive means of collecting each issue. In addition, the introduction of advertising on Phonecard has generated new interest with the increase in avenues for thematic collectors to pursue.

Telecom Australia anticipated the growth of phonecard collecting and established the Phonecard Collector Service to cater for the needs of collectors and to ensure that new Phonecard designs are accessible to all Australian collectors.

The Phonecard Collector Service is a free support service for Phonecard collectors and is responsible for designing and producing Limited Editions. It seeks constant feedback from its customers through surveys and personal liason with collectors, dealers and collector's clubs. As a result of this feedback, the Service has recently introduced a number of new initiatives to meet the needs of its growing membership.

To ensure that Phonecard is easily accessible to collectors, a mail order service has been operating since 1990 to provide an outlet for all new designs, and recently a Standing Order system was introduced.

Another new feature is the popular Phonecard collector 0055 Hotline, which allows collectors instant access to the latest Phonecard news. Offering information on upcomong releases, the availability of previous releases and the latest serial and batch numbers, the Hotline is updated regularly.

Whilst originally a 'teenage hobby', Phonecard is now collected by people of all ages and from all walks of life. There are nearly equal numbers of students and white collar workers and three quarters of Phonecard

collectors are male. The largest collections tend to belong to people over 35, with the average number of cards in a collection currently totalling 241 (Phonecard Collector Survey of 1,000 collectors).

Collectors can obtain the five year birthday Phonecard from retail outlets throughout December only, or by writing to the Phonecard Collector Service at Locked Bag 5350, Parramatta, NSW 2150.

NEW RELEASES - OFFICIAL ISSUES

Telecom's next <u>Advertising card</u> was due to be released in November. Approximately 400,000 of this card commissioned by the Newsagents Assoc. are due to be released (see page 16).

In January, Telecom will release its annual <u>Australia</u> <u>Day card</u>. The 1995 card is somthing completely different in Phonecard design and uses a combination of photography and illustration to depict the faces of three young Australians (see page 16).

The "Invisible Heritage" set, containing a \$5, \$10 and a \$20 card, will be released in February. This bright, stunning and unusual series features unique paintings of Australian insects in their natural environment, as depicted by Australian artist, Sue Maddern. The set will be packaged in a Limited Edition folder and will be available in Telecom's January Catalogue for \$45.50 (see page 16).

Following the "Invisible Heritage' set, will be another first for Phonecard - the "Local Legends" competition. Advertised in local newspapers, this nationwide competition aimed to discover and honour those individuals whose presence in their community enriches the lives of local people. The series of eight cards - one "Legend" from each State and Territory - will be released in April, 1995, in a limited Edition folder.

PHONECARD ADVERTISING AND COLLECTOR SERVICES (PACS)

PACS has announced details of its next series of three Telecom Australia cards, PACS 16 to 18, which feature the <u>Australian Open Golf</u> (see page 16). These cards will be available both loose and in a pack. Only 2,000 of these packs will be available to collectors. RRP for the pack is \$59.00.

Due in December, PACS will be producing a \$2.00 card for a <u>Taubmans/BBC Hardware</u> promotion. This card will be used as a giveaway with a paint purchase from BBC Hardware. It won't be hard to pick the houses of phonecard collectors. The card will be packaged by PACS for sale through its dealer network.

Two separate packs will be available on the popular cartoon themes, the <u>Simpsons and the Flintstones</u>, to be issued about the third week of January, 1995. The January cover of the APM will also feature the two cartoon themes.

THE PHONECARD COLLECTOR SERVICE (PCS)

Term and Conditions for Collectors

As the number of collectors registering on Telecom's mailing list continues to grow, PCS has had to re-evaluate information from collectors in order to implement an internal security and control system regarding restrictions on Limited Edition folders. This ensures the allocation system is fairer to everybody.

New collectors will be asked to provide the following information when registering. These conditions must be adhered to by any collector registered on the PCS mailing list. Any collector objecting to any of the following terms and conditions may inform the PCS in writing and they will be removed from the mailing list on request.

- . Membership is open to all members of the general public.
- . All membership applications must be in writing to the PCS and contain details as follows;
 - (a) full name
 - (b) residential address of intending member
 - (c) date of birth
- (d) home & work contact numbers. Goods may be delivered to a PO Box address only after the members residential address has been verified.
- . Collectors must reside at the address tendered and registered with the Phonecard Collector Service
- . The PCS may request additional information from collectors containing multiple listings of collectors at any time
- . Collectors will comply with any limits imposed on products, which can be varied at any time at the discretion of the PCS
- . Any purchased product will <u>only</u> be delivered to the registered collector address, and not the person paying for the product, should they be different
- . Collectors must complete an official Phonecard Collector Service order form for any Phonecard order to be accepted and processed
- . Any collector who provides deceptive information or conducts enethical collecting practices will have their membership terminated immediately
- . The PCS reserves the right to decline or withdraw membership at its discretion.

PACIFIC COIN COMPANY LTD

At the International Phonecard Fair held in Sydney on Sunday, the 13th of November, New Zealand's 'Pacific Coin Company' released its packaged set of 4 x \$50 Telecom Australia Phonecards, titled "Animal Eyes". These cards feature a close-up photo of the face and eyes of four different animals, and are based on a popular set of five (identical minus one) designs originally featured on New Zealand Telecom PhoneCards (see page 18, September issue APM).







CARDPHONE AUSTRALIA PTY LTD

Frank Wilden, Cardphone Australia, reports that the company was able to provide the Victoria Racing Club with their entire public payphone service for the Spring Racing Carnival.

This was the inauguration of the Cardphone Australia service and was an unqualified success, catering to the aggregate attendance of 202,000 people. Seven telephones were provided for the week of the Cup Carnival,. Three were situated outside of the cloakroom, with the other four telephones being sited in the base of the hill stand.

Frank advised that the hardware and software "operated (98.8% fault free from the beginning of the Carnival and 100% fault free from the commencement of Day 2 (Melbourne Cup Day)".

The final figure for the total amount of calls made are yet to come to hand, however, a total is "in the 1,000's and must represent one of the most intensive field trials ever undertaken in the world of telecommunications". It is worth knowing that due to a print problem, the

printage of cards for use in the telephones was significantly reduced from that previously advised. The correct details are:-

\$10 Subzero 785 numbered, 200 un-numbered \$20 Lets Elope 785 numbered, 200 un-numbered

Cardphone Australia are currently in the process of concluding negotiations for the permanent installation of their payphones in a number of government and non-government sites around the country, as well as for the provision with temporary payphone service for a major sporting event to be held during January, 1995.

PayTel Australia

A formal issuing policy will be released by PayTel in January, 1995. This policy will reflect Paytel's planned releases for the 1995 year and will define the numbers of cards card values and the packs to be issued for each release.

Collectors will be interested to know that:-

- . PayTel determines a card print run to reflect a minimum of 50% usage on PayTel payphones, and the remainder to the collector market.
- . Of the cards allocated for collectors, usually 2,500 sets are put aside for numbered Collector Packs. Of the total issue of Collector Packs, up to 300 are sold through each user's sales organisations to actual payphone users for use in the payphones. This usage in effect means that over 50% of cards issued, are utilised in PayTel's payphones.
- . During 1995, PayTel will be releasing approximately eight issues including additional cards and sets in "The Heritage Collection", "Lighthouse Series" and "Railways of Australia Series".
- . PayTel card face values are decided in conjunction with payphone user groups. It is anticipated that no cards in excess of \$20 face value will be issued during 1995.
- . PayTel pack pricing policy of approximately \$5 above face value will be maintained during 1995.

THE GRAPEVINE

by Insider

Well, I am tempted to claim credit for knowing the Australia Day 1992 Collector Pack did not sell out completely (1 left!) but missing the 32 Australia Day 1993 Packs sort of lets me down! Congratulations to the winners of the competition-both results were very close.

What do the results mean? The most obvious points from the figures are

- * the sell out of Geelong packs,
- * many other packs selling between the 3700 and 4200 mark.
- * the most common Packs are the Limited Editions!!

"The sell-out of Geelong packs?"

The most likely reason for the Geelong packs nearly selling 3 times the other packs is that this pack alone amongst early Telecom packs was bought up by the speculators. Considering that the number of collectors 4 years ago was only a fraction of today's figure (which is still growing at a constant rate), then the packs coming after the Geelong pack were to a large extent ignored by the majority of speculators at the time. The speculators bought a smaller number of packs form South Australia onwards but not anywhere near enough to result in an oversupply today. Packs in dealers hands were actually quite limited and as so often happens once another event brings this fact to peoples attention prices then rise quickly to more realistic levels. This other event was the production by Telecom of the Limited Edition pack. Because early packs were produced in 10,000 issues, and the Limited Edition was only produced in 7000 (Australia Day 1992), collectors and dealers thought they were more scarce than the state packs. Telecom must have known the reverse was the case and so are partially responsible for the speculation that took place. The result of all this is that the Limited Editions will continue to be the most common packs obtainable and so they should once again be selling for around 35% over issue price when they



sell out. Of course speculators only bought the Limited Edition packs under many pseudo names to capitalise on the short term profit to be had by immediately selling back to dealers. Now the pressure is of!!!

Dealers will not need to stock up beyond their normal levels and so anyone buying a Limited Edition Pack had better want one for their collection or expect to sit on it for at least 12 months. By the way, I never managed to sell packs back to dealers within 12 months of a product going off sale in the pastprobably because dealers bought their requirements just prior to a pack being withdrawn from the market place. A certain number of the state packs would have been destroyed by dealers taking out the mint cards and disposing of the empty packs. These figures are totally unknown so we will assume that most are still available. If we assume that only 20 dealers have a total of 15 packs each (a conservative figure), and that every

collector collecting packs would have one of each type then the most packs in collector hands would be around 2500 (2954 Olympic Packs meaning that any figure above 2654 would be in dealer and investor hands). This means the number of excess to 2654 which are held by investors to be supplied as future stock is shown in the above table.

The graph below shows the number available and the average dealer price at the Sydney fair on November 12/13th. From this it can be determined which packs are over or under priced. Remember that the number of collectors in this new hobby are still in the embryonic stages. This hobby is set to grow enormously over the next 5 years if the experiences in the rest of the world are anything to go on. So use this diagram as a guide only. The line drawn through the graphed points indicates that packs above the line are probably overpriced and packs under the line are probably underpriced. The packs are plotted in order from the table on the previous page. A column showing corrected prices for the above packs is added to the above table. Remember these are only guides to prices. The calculations will be wrong if the number of packs in circulation is widely different to those figures in above table. This could be brought about by packs from early issues being thrown away for example.



The effect on the curved line as more collectors begin to collect phonecards is for the curve to move to the right.

- From this analysis it appears that at the saleable amount of collector packs at this point in time would be around 4000 in quantity. Of course as the number of collectors increase over time the demand will eventually push these prices up. Why is Telecom producing 9500 Xmas Packs???
- Although the Geelong pack looks grossly overpriced I doubt if it will come down much if at all as it is always in demand and a lot of these packs would have been thrown away especially considering that the "tear" perforation often separates and makes the pack useless.
- The Limited Edition Packs do have their own prefix number which does increase the demand as prefix collectors need one pack card now. The number of prefix collectors is quite large but impossible to quantify so their influence could skew the data by keeping recent pack prices higher than this analysis suggest.
- Many Geelong, Tasmania, NT, and Western Australia packs were also broken up to make used sets!

Best buys from this list? Olympics, Australia day 1993, and ACT.

Worst buys? Surf Lifesaving, Xmas 1994 and the next 3 Telecom "Limited Edition" Releases!!

Best Advice? Only have one name on Telecom's mailing list!

Benefits of this situation are that the packs will stay close to issue price for 6 months to 12 months and then will increase in price at a reasonable rate thus allowing present collectors the chance not to miss out in a lucky dip and for the new collectors to pick up the recent packs at leisure without the stress of having to buy this week or pay a penalty!

I was going to discuss recent custom card issues but the end of the page is fast approaching so,until next month.

NEW ZEALAND NEWS UPDATE

Combination PhoneCard and Raffle Ticket

A PhoneCard that doubles as a raffle ticket is the latest innovation to come out of Telecom New Zealand.

Produced to raise money for the Royal New Zealand Foundation for the Blind, the two \$5 AdCard designs sell for a retail price of \$10. This means, that in addition to the \$5 calling value, a unique numbering system on the back of each card allows the PhoneCard holder the chance to win major prizes such as a Ford Telstar, a first class return ticket for two to London, a Kenwood stereo and a Samsung TV and VCR.

A total of 40,000 of each of the two designs have been produced for the Foundation. The cards also carry the logos of NZ Post, Liquorland, Cathay Pacific and Ford, who are supporting sponsors of the PhoneCard promotion.

Official Telecom PhoneCard Catalogue

An important reference tool for collectors of Telecom New Zealand PhoneCards will be the first official catalogue, which is due for publication in December. The catalogue will feature every PhoneCard that

The catalogue will feature every PhoneCard that Telecom has produced - from the trial issues through to 30 June, 1994.

Designed as an information guide for both new and long-standing collectors, the catalogue will cover general issue cards, Collector packs, and AdCards including a breakdown on Event Cards, FUNdCards and Special cards. In addition, there will be a history of the development of Payphones and Cardphones in New Zealand.

Priced at approximately \$NZ20, this Catalogue will be an important resource for collectors. This inaugural Catalogue will be the only one that covers the history of New Zealand PhoneCards - as the next one will cover only product released from 1 July 1994, to 30 June 1995.

Anyone wishing to order a Catalogue can do so, by contacting the Telecom PhoneCard Collector Service, PO Box 2590, Auckland, New Zealand.

America'a Cup Excitement

The history of New Zealand's exciting challenge for the America's Cup has now been captured on a series of eight \$5 AdCards. The cards feature action shots of the New Zealand challengers from the Plastic Fantastic, through to the big boat, The Red Sled, and now the latest contender - the Black Beast.

The AdCards have been commissioned by Lion Breweries, as Steinlager are a major sponsor of the 1995 Team New Zealand America's Cup campaign. Single cards will be available from participating liquor outlets in February 1995.

New Technology "Smart" PhoneCards

Telecom New Zealand has just issued its first ever AdCard with a computer chip, which can be used to buy goods and services as well as make phone calls.

In conjunction with Cardnet Technology, Telecom has introduced four cards which have a calling value of \$5 - but computer chips worth different amounts. These include \$20, \$30 and \$50 values, which can be decoded by card readers which Cardnet Technology has installed in various retail outlets around the country.

The series is available from dealers as single cards - and also as a Collector Pack.

A note to overseas collectors: although the Telecom portion of the cards - the \$5 calling value - has no time limit, the retail section is valid only until June 1995. Those collectors wishing to maintain the mint status of their cards should be aware that the silicon chip component of these cards can get marked in the decoder, just as it would in a Cardphone.

NEW RELEASES

Shotover Jet - This \$5 AdCard is being sold through jet boat operations in the South Island and other tourist related outlets. Shotover Jet Ltd have produced this card to commemorate their millionth paying passenger and their 25th year of operation in 1995.

Of the total of 21,000 cards produced, 3,500 will be included in a special commemorative pack which will be available to tourists, whilst Telecom will distribute 5,500 single cards through tourist designations in Auckland, Wellington and Christchurch. A 1,000 will be held by Shotover Jet for later use, whilst the balance of cards will held for inclusuion in upcoming New Zealand and International AdCard Volumes and for single card sales to dealers.

Christmas Gift Cards - This set of 2 x \$5 (31,000 of each) and 1 x \$10 (16,000), combination greeting cards and PhoneCards, are next in the series of GIFTCards Whitcoulls have produced to compliment their range of greeting cards.

Whitcoulls will be taking 20,000 of each of the \$5 cards and 5,000 of the \$10 cards, to be sold throughout their retail stores nationwide.

The balance of cards will be inserted in AdCard Volumes and sold as GIFTCards to dealers.

Snow White - Following the tremendous success of their last release, "Lion King", Event Masters are now producing their next series of Disney PhoneCards featuring "Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs" (19,000 of each design x 3 x \$5).

Event Masters will be distributing 7,500 of each of the Snow White cards. A limited number will be combined with the video in a special presentation set. The rest of the Event Masters cards will be sold in single packs.

The balance of cards will be held for AdCard Volumes and for single card sales to dealers.

SYDNEY STAMP CENTRE

The Sydney Stamp Centre has been appointed as the distributor of the Trial series of the Sydney Monorail Pass Cards. These cards, commissioned by Thomas Nationwide Transport (TNT) have been printed by Pacific Phonecard Pty Ltd.

The cards, featured opposite, have been printed in quantities as follows; 8 Ride Pass (2,000), 10 Ride Pass (2,000) and 12 Ride Pass (1,000). A total of 1,000 of each will be packaged and will be available for sale at \$95.00. The balance of cards will be sold at Monorail outlets as part of the Trial.

The TNT Monorail officially came into being in January, 1996, when a contract was signed between the Darling Harbour Authority and TNT. Following construction work, the Monorail eventually opened in late July, 1988, and carried its first fare paying passenger on August, that year. Since that time Monorail has carried some 18 million passengers and travelled around one million kilometres.

The initial fare for a "ride" was set at \$1.00 in 1986 and was increased to \$2.00 in April, 1989. In August, 1992, the standard fare was increased to \$2.50, with pensioners at \$1.25 - therefore an 8 Ride Pass costs \$20.00, etc.

Featured opposite in colour, are also the three AmeriVox Jose Carreras phonecards as featured in the last issue of this magazine. The three cards, which relate to the three concerts performed by Carreras in Australia and New Zealand, are available in a pack, of which only 1,500 have been produced. 




REFLECTIONS ON THE SYDNEY INTERNATIONAL PHONECARD FAIR

This year's International Phonecard Fair run by MEF Books and Mark Freehill (13 November) was once again a 'roaring success'. Dealers and collectors from all around Australia obviously look forward to this Sydney Fair, held each November and March, judging from the huge crowds in attendance.

Thinking back to the very first International Phonecard Fair organised 'way back' in March, 1993 (it seems so long ago!), my first recollection would have to be the range of stock available back then compared with this latest Fair. Back in March 1993, most dealers were mainly stamp and coin dealers carrying phonecards as a new line. Most dealers' stock consisted of used Australian cards and very little mint product or world issues were available at all in the room. Nowdays though, the number of dealers must be about 150% more than in 1993 and the range of stock has increased enormously. Most dealers have developed a 'speciality' area of their own and of course most dealers had a range of Australian cards for sale.

The varied range of world cards was impressive to see. Table displays were very interesting as no two tables appeared alike, compared with the first Fair when all tables vied for an effective display with a very limited range of perhaps 40 Australian cards and 10 packs for sale, with perhaps a little foreign material.

First prize for the most colourfull display must go to Jan and Michael Goldstein of "J & M's Elegance in Phonecards", who had 12 feet of world cards and thematics on their table, which certainly caught the collector's attention on their entering the room.

Dealers are faced with a large range of Australian and world cards from which to choose from. Some dealers are attempting to specialise in particular areas. Peter Granfield of Intercards, was discussing with me how hard it is to track down some of those cards from the 'hard to get' countries. Peter has a large range from over 130 countries in stock and did much business with collectors looking for cards from specific countries.

Other dealers had cards from a particular country such as the USA, or China.

All dealers reported good sales in their appropriate areas. It would not be possible to say either 'this or that' sold better than some other type of cards as each dealer had a different tale to tell, however, it seemed that everything was selling well somewhere in the room.

Prefixes were in strong demand - prefix collectors have started to buy more at Fairs than they used to - in the main because Telecom have started to issue cards,

with some prefixes only becoming available in certain states, etc., so collectors have to 'visit' these other areas or else buy from a dealer.

It was good to see so many new collectors in the room finding out as much as they could about collecting and I think they would have been impressed with the huge range on show.

It appears obvious that the collector base is expanding and Telecom are to be congratulated on their efforts so far to promote the hobby.

Collectors were present at the Fair in full force throughout the whole day and it appears dealers will have to anticipate an even busier Sydney International Phonecard Fair in March, 1995!

The front of the two cards are featured in colour on page 33 of this issue, whilst below are reproduced the reverse side of Sunday's Collector card and a SPECIMEN ONLY card (no number). Only 100 of the Speciman Only cards exist, for each of the 2 days.



FOCUS ON FARAWAY PLACES

by Cyril Fox

The West African nation of Gabon (officially the Gabonese Republic) is perhaps best known for the hospital established at Lambarene many years ago by Dr Albert Schweitzer.

Three quarters of the country is covered by dense equatorial rainforest. The capital, Libreville (population about 250,000) is hardly more than a large town by world standards.

Phonecard collecting has hardly had a great start in Gabon. I read an account about six months ago about a certain Rabemila Tsiry, a collector in Libreville, who, like so many other collectors worldwide, developed the habit of checking callboxes on his way to and from work each day. Well, Mr Tsiry was arrested for his "interference" with the public telephone system and spent two days behind bars before he was released on appeal to the Minister of Telecommunications!

Phonecards were first issued in Gabon way back in 1985 by O.P.T. (Office des Postes et Telecommunications). These were magnetic cards by Autelca of Switzerland:-

3100F blue & black on a white backing - 220,000 6200F yellow & black on a white backing - 90,000 The first card issue had plain backs; the second issue (1987) had the same designs again on the fronts but carried advertisments on the backs:-

3100F "MBOLO notre metier: les prix" 6200F "SCORE notre metier: les prix"





The third issue was similar again; this time with a new logo and a slight increase in the face value of the cards:-

3250F - 100,000 6500F - ? A single green 10 unit "Economy Card" followed; presumably it was only good for local calls.




About 1992, the Autelca cards were replaced by Schlumberger chip cards. The first chip card issue pictured a large O.P.T. logo:-

10 units - blue logo 50 units - green logo 150 units - red logo



Chip varieties are known for this issue.

Finally, a second issue of chip cards appeared about a year ago. These cards show a map of Gabon segmented into call zones. The card values are unchanged from the previous issue:-



It takes only 13 cards (excluding chip varieties) to have a complete collection from Gabon.

The issues of 1985 and 1987 are becoming really hard to track down and perseverance, rather than "lots of loot" will be the key to successfully collecting this country.

A WORLD VIEW

THEMATIC - Christmas

From INTERCARDS by Peter Granfield

It seemed appropriate that we look this month at the theme of Christmas. Australia's contribution is already famous as one of the 'blue chip' issues in any Australian collection. Up to now, this theme is not a large one as not many countries have really entered into the revenue earning side of phonecard issues. It would seem certain, that as many more countries begin to issue in the same frequency as stamps, that we can expect many more additions to the theme. Perhaps, now is a good time to start on this theme if it has a passing interest to you.

A few countries that have been issuing for a number of years, have produced some interesting cards and some are quite elusive. Examples being in the Caribbean Islands, where some of the cards were issued as complimentaries in very low quantities. We have one overseas client on our books who has already put together an extensive collection on this theme, amounting to 189 different cards at the last count. One good feature of this theme is that it has very defined parameters. The only digression that seems to occur is where cards are issued for the Christmas and New Year season, rather than solely Christmas.

<u>Belgium</u> - is one of the countries that has already issued many cards on this theme. The card illustrated has the added appeal that it is always created by the use of children.

<u>Croatia</u> - this card appears to be their first Christmas issue, but with the multitude of new issues coming from them, we very much doubt that this will be their last.


<u>Denmark</u> - has seen three cards issued to date. The one illustrated, issued by KTAS, being rather 'cute' with further appeal to other themes. Other Danish companies have also issued cards on this theme.














Great Britain - this card was made to look like a Christmas present and was produced by British Telecom. It also has the bonus of being purchased in a matching cardboard gift envelope designed for giving as a Christmas present. BT has produced other similar packages. Mercury has also produced at least 15 cards for Christmas.

Ireland - this is Ireland's second Christmas issue. Unlike some countries, they have so far limited themselves to one card for Christmas. Their first card showed Santa in a phonebox and it is already hard to find and valueable.

Jamaica - there is no doubt that this card is issued for Christmas. Although Jamaica has issued several cards each December since 1990, not all have specific Christmas designs although each has Dec. and the year on the front.

<u>Japan</u> - for a country with only 2.5% of the population being Christian in beleif, it is interesting that NTT has issued so many cards on the theme of Christmas. We have sighted 44 different cards and no doubt many more exist as they are done in such small quantities and distribution is so localised. The majority of these cards feature Santa Claus which is a compromise from a non Christian nation. The card illustrated is by far one of the most attractive and has a very American flavour.

Montserrat - Christmas 1991 was the occasian this card was issued and only 2,250 were produced. Other Carribean Islands to have Christmas issues are Cayman (3), St. Kitts and Nevis (2) and St. Lucia (1).

New Zealand - commenced with Christmas issues in a big way in 1990 by issuing 5 cards. This was followed in 1991 with 4 cards and 1992 with none. December 1993 saw the issue of a set of 4 flowers with no mention of Christmas. Their plans for 1994 do not include a Christmas issue, so this is a reversal in the trend of other countries.

Singapore - we are not aware of any other Christmas issues from Singapore but this card was part of a set of 4 issued for Christmas 1990. The set comprised 2 x \$10 cards plus a \$20 and \$50. The first three are commonly seen but the \$50 card is rarely found. The \$10 cards featured Santa over the airport and the city skyline, whilst the \$20 card showed Santa outside Raffles Hotel and the \$50 one depicted a snowman outside Sentosa.



Other countries we are aware of that have issued cards for Christmas are:-

Finland, Germany, Gibraltar, Hong Kong, Hungary, Indonesia, Italy, Jersey, Netherlands, Portugal, Seychelles, Sweden, and USA (GTS).

We take this opportunity to extend the seasons greatings to all the magazine readers and hope that you have a happy Christmas and a joyous New Year and may your stocking be full of phonecards!







AN UNSCHEDULED STOP

Our Qantas 747 took off from Changi Airport, Singapore, bound for London. We were soon served a meal by the flight attendants and after a while, most of the passengers settled into sleep mode and the cabin lights were turned down for our convenience.

We were about six hours into our journey, when the cabin lights were turned on as were the video screens. The map on the screen indicated we were over Iran, except the aircraft had turned around and was 'back tracking' where we had been. The fasten seat belt sign came on but no announcement from the public address system. Ten minutes later the Captain announced that the pressurisation motors had closed down on the aircraft and that the oxygen masks would drop from the ceiling and asked everyone to put them on (they really do drop down). He also announced that the aircraft was going to fly at a lower altitude and that we were heading for Karachi in Pakistan for repairs.

There was no need to panic as the plane was flying smoothly and the engines had the same rythm as before, but there was an air of uncertainty as to what was going to happen next.

One and a half hours later we landed and after a long delay, the 250 passengers were finally taken off the aircraft and bussed to the transit lounge at Karachi airport.

Many people had important appointments to keep, so there was a rush for the payphones around the airport by the passengers to alter forwarding timetables. The Pakistanis 'caught on quickly' that there was a problem, because they posted a man beside each telephone in the airport who was selling a phonecard to each user. They also collected the used one as the person had finished the call. I wandered around and watched how they operated.

There were three different payphone companies (see cards) within the bounds of the airport all competing to be used, but no card was compatible to any other payphone. This is where I could see a proposition looming up!

I had a quantity of Australian Opera House and Kangaroo generic phonecards in my hand luggage. WHATS IN A NAME?

Well, the revolution has started - corporate advertising has hit the scene. Yes, the 'big boys and girls' of industry have begun to realise the marketing potential of the humble phonecard. Stand back and watch the corporate giants thrust and parry while they compete with each other for a bigger slice of the consumer cake.

Phonecards are thriving as a hobby and the whiz kids of the advertising world have not been sleeping. The multi-national K-Mart group started the ball rolling in their modest way and were followed closely by the brewing company XXXX. These two companies set up the 'big but cheap coverage' scene for future advertisers and although they didn't set the phonecard world 'on fire' at the time, they are now slowly finding their way into most collections as a valuable and worthwhile addition. Both these cards were issued by their companies at face value and with the lowest quantity of 50,000 for the \$10 and \$20 K-Mart cards, were certainly available by all collectors young and old. Now some months down the track, these two cards have started to be traded for something like two to three times their face value and are still bringing good prices for quality one hole and used cards.

Heard this story before? These two corporate giants showed the faith to purchase \$5, \$10 and \$20 cards at little more than face value and in quantities that would freak out weaker companies and yet they still have managed to keep everybody happy. Good product, good price and available if you got up and went looking.

The companies, their marketing agencies, the buying public (phonecard users), phonecard dealers and most importantly - you the collector, were all given the chance to get some of the action.

Now we are at the crossroads - how many companies are willing to take the plunge and invest in their future and in our hobby world of collectables. With new (reduced) issue quantities and probable reduced Telecom unit costs, TOYOTA has taken the lead in the initiative stakes and issued a classy \$5 card as a marketing tool to assess their place in the very competitive but extremely lucrative new car market. Quantities of this 30,000 issue card managed to find its way out into the wide world of collectors. As part of the apparent arrangement between Toyota and Telecom, the card was to be only distributed in NSW and was also only to be available from selected Toyota dealers. Because of the clasification of 'Advertising', under Telecom's policy, a small quantity had to be made available to collectors at face value.

Because of the 'mid range' quantity and the element of surprise, these cards were selling very briskly for around \$15 at 'out of city' NSW fairs during the last weeks of August, when issued. The story goes that there were quite a large quantity on offer - perhaps more people could have been told that they are to be available at face value from Telecom Parramatta and who did get them early?

Big busines these little bits of plastic. Yes, and they are an ideal tool to assist just about any company get the edge over their business opponents. Now I've never been one to push the barrow for Telecom, but I have to agree that they are on a huge winner if they follow suit and 'play their cards' correctly. Who knows what or which companies have already signed up, but it's a sure bet that the companies that market their product via the circle of phonecard collectors will certainly reap the rewards.

Who's going to be next? Maybe buy a 'BIG' Scottish hamburger and get a free phonecard to help promote a new home delivery service?? Or, what about a bonus phonecard from one of our city stores to allow you a free call to check on their super specials for their 'special' customers?

Would you accept one of these cards if offered free or at the very least, at face value? You bet you would! And so would anybody in their 'right mind', collector or not.

If you and I and every genuine collector is going to be snowballed with heaps and heaps of new issue phonecards, how about if these cards come around at FACE VALUE. Sounds good doesn't it.

Maybe, just maybe, it could all be possible. Sounds like a good OPTION - collecting just ADVERTISING cards that are sold at face value or given away free. Now that would really bring a challenge back to the market place, with both collectors and card producers. The challenge is there - produce cards that are attreactive, have a marketing potential, and are at a realistic price for the producer, user and collector.

So come all you companies needing a boost - get out and talk to Telecom. I'm sure that you can both work out a deal that's profitable for everyone, including the collector. Let's get the phonecard consumer and the collector working together once again like we all were when we started in this hobby. Let's get some new and exciting cards onto the scene at a realistic price for all collectors so that new and used cards can once again be collected by collectors of ALL ages.

And let's get the 'thrill of the chase' back into the hobby insted of having collectors playing in the 'monopoly money' stakes!

After all, what's in a name - good value, service and the right price?













