#### **EDITORIAL**

One aspect of my previous employment was that in a politically sensitive environment one had to be aware of change and be able to understand the reasoning behind such change and adapt to it. I can assure readers that 'change' was a constant occurrence.

Whilst my environment is now different, I perceive continuous changes taking place, be it on the corporate or company scene or being proposed in relation to the

development of phonecard technology and the subsequent impact on collectors.

As most readers will by now be aware, Telecom Australia 'no longer exists', ie. it has been replaced in wording by Telstra or Telstra Corporation (see page 9 for further clarification).

Already I am being asked if I know what is the last Phonecard to have Telecom Australia printed on on it and the first with Telstra printed on it! Up until now we have seem a number of modifications to the reverse side of Phonecards, now a major modification has occurred to the front of the card.

I feel such a major change provides a 'bench mark' for collectors and an opportunity to collect both in reverse and forward with clearly defined parameters, ie. "I'll collect all the Telecom cards" or "I'll start with collecting all of the Telstra cards as I came late on the scene", etc.

Elsewhere in the magazine readers will note reports on major technological changes - the first phonecard operated facsimile machine as developed by Payphonics and the innovative, combined cellular and satellite payphones developed by PayTel. Again these open up a new avenue of collecting as cards with different coding, markings, etc. are produced.

As a prefix collector I was interested in seeing that a further two publications had been compiled in relation to recording phonecards by prefix number; one listing being prepared through the Australian Phonecard Collectors Club (not yet sighted) and the other by Glen Bellamy, a member of the Sydney Phonecard Collectors Club.

The latter publication has, I feel, great merit in that it is the first complete listing of all phonecards produced by all phonecard producers, ie. not just by Telecom/Telstra. I myself have just commenced a project wherby I have started compiling material for the publication of a complete phonecard catalogue with all cards printed by the four card producers being reproduced, in colour and catalogued. This will be a first in this country.

A number of innovative chapters will be included, eg. a chapter on the cards that were designed to proof stage but never produced (or in some cases printed but not released), with collectors being able to see images that never 'saw the light of day'. Gaps in the 'missing prefix listing' will be filled. More on this in the next issue.

Later this week I will be preparing for my visit to Melbourne for the 'Big' weekend of the 8th and 9th. It will be a chance to meet Victorian readers and collectors and I am looking forward to it. I'll be away from Tamworth for about two weeks as I intend to visit my family in the Riverland of South Australia as well. In addition I will be visiting the APCC meeting on the evening of 11 July so again, I will have the opportunity to 'put faces to voices over the phone'.

Someone will be 'clearing' the answering machine and passing on messages but again I ask that you bear with me in regards to any tardiness in responding.

The printer awaits this last page and I must deliver.



# "SEEK UNITY" SAYS PHONECARD

Renowned artist and 1995 Australian of the Year Arthur Boyd OBE, on 25 July 1995 named Victorian student Paul Smith as the winner of the 1995 Telstra Phonecard TM Design Award.

Smith's winning designs were unveiled at a ceremony at the Museum of Contemporary Art in Sydney and will be released nationally on a series of three Phonecards in August. His entry beat a record 420 designs from students enrolled in 24 accredited graphic design institutions around Australia.

In commemoration of the United Nation's International Year for Tolerance, the theme for the 1995 Award was Living Together in Australia. Paul's inter-related trilogy titled 'Don't hide behind fences - seek unity' uses pencil and ink illustrations to depict three classic Australian scenes which reflect the spirit of Australia and today's multicultural climate.

Paul Smith, the winning designer, said he was thrilled his designs would be featured on a Phonecard series nationally and internationally as a collector item. "In each of three Phonecard designs, the fences which represent society's barriers, are being progressively broken down", says Paul. "Through my designs, I would like to encorage people to seek unity and live together in harmony in The International Year for Tolerance and the years to come.

Paul, 21, is the youngest of eight children and lives on a farm in Narre Warren near Dandenong, Victoria. He has been drawing since he was a child and is now in his third year of study for a Degree in graphics design at the Swinburne University of Technology.

Janet Sayer, National General Manager, Telstra Payphone Services, said that the Design Award is a way of developing the talents of young graphic designers in Australia and provide them with an opportunity to use their skills to produce a commercial product.

"Since its introduction in Australia in 1990, Phonecard has experienced high community acceptance. One in three Australians have bought a phonecard and 98% of the population are aware of phonecard", Ms Sayers said. "By using a Phonecard design to encourage Australians to live together in harmony in The International Year for Tolerance, we are literally getting the message straight into the hands of a vast number of Australians".

The Telstra Phonecard Design Award is a bi-annual, national competition open to full-time tertiary graphic design students sponsored by Telstra in conjunction with the Australian Graphic Design Association.

## AUSTRALIAN NEWS UPDATE

#### **TELSTRA CORPORATION**

As indicated briefly in the Editorial, readers will note that the wording Telecom Australia will no longer be appearing on Phonecard, letterhead, publications, etc. This wording has been/will be replaced by Telstra or Telstra Corporation Ltd.

Until now, Telstra has traded in Australia as Telecom but with full deregulation of the communications market due in 1997, it has been decided to utilise only the one identity (Telstra) to alleviate confusion over the two names.

A great deal of restructuring has taken place within Telstra/Telecom over a period of time. As readers are probably aware, the Government owns Telstra, although the public has a greater perception of Telstra as a corporate body more so than as a government entity.


The next likely step for Telstra (although denied by the Labour Government) will almost certainly be privatisation. If a change of government takes place, privatisation would be automatic as the Liberal/National coalition has stated its policy is to sell Telstra.

Already Australia's most profitable company, the giant Telecom group has been valued at up to \$30 billion, just under the value of BHP!

Anyway, back to Phonecards which will be with us (in one form or another) whatever takes place.


#### **OFFICIAL ISSUES**

#### CLOSED USER GROUP CARDS

A total of 15,000 of Telstra's \$5 Victorian Prison Phonecards have been made available at face value to Telstra 'registered' dealers. Sprintpak in Melbourne is handling the distribution with dealers able to (at this stage) obtain up to 200 of the cards.

A card which was initially likely to be quite ellusive (and costly) is now readily available (in mint condition).

It is not known at this time as to whether the \$10 card will be available in the same fashion.

#### **ADVERTISING CARDS**

Featured opposite are three further additions to Telstra's Advertising card category, the \$10 and \$20 **Australian Swimming and Diving** cards and the \$20 **Lifeline** card.

#### one AUSTRALIA SET

This set of cards continues to attract considerable interest with the question on 'everyone's' lips being - will those cards held by Telecom be destroyed (some 9,500+). **As at 27 June they had not been!** 

#### **NSW TOURIST COMMISSION**

The three \$2 cards commissioned by the NSW Tourist Commission (Ken Done artwork - prefix numbers 668, 669, 670) have been printed and are awaiting encoding at Rosehill (Sydney).

Telstra is awaiting advice from the Commission as to when/if the cards will be collected.

#### **ROAM AUSTRALIA**

This company commissioned the production of a number of Telecom Phonecards on a variety of themes.

At present, a number of these phonecards are either being retained by Telstra or have not been printed.

In the former category fall the following cards:

**WW II series** - 1 x \$5, 4 x \$2 cards.

1,000 issued to Roam with 9,000 still being held by Telstra

Middle East Peace Accord - 3 x \$2 cards

1,000 issued to Roam with 9,000 still being held by Telstra

Apollo - 1 x each of \$2, \$5, \$10, \$20 & \$50 cards

The cards (prefix no's. 621, 622, 623, 626, 627)

have been printed but not released by Telstra

In the latter category falls:

Sporting Legends - 4 x \$2 cards

These cards (prefix no's. 731 to 734) have not yet been printed and may not be printed

All of the above phonecards are subject to legal proceedings instigated by Roam Australia Pty Ltd against Telstra Corporation Ltd.

In the Federal Court in Sydney on Friday, the 23rd of June, a preliminary hearing was held to set a date for the full hearing of claims levelled by Roam Australia against Telstra. The Judge set a date of 24 August 1995 for this hearing.

Basically, a contractual dispute between Roam Australia and Telstra will be heard as will be a number of other allegations by Roam against alleged contravention of sections of the Trade Practices Act by Telstra.

What I found interesting at the initial hearing was the handing of a Telecom Phonecard to the Judge to familiarise him with its existence!

As a result of the above court case, it is unlikely that the cards identified above will be released until the matter is resolved in late August (unless settlement is made out of court). Depending on the outcome, they may never be released!

I will keep you informed as matters evolve -Ed.

#### **Letter to the Editor**

Sir - I wish to elicit the help of your readers on the subject of Telecom's \$5 "Thank You" card.

I have reason to believe that this card may exist in two or even three distinct varieties. Unfortunately there are too few of these cards in the hands of nearby collectors for me to prove my theory; hence my plea for help.

I have here a "Thank You" card with the following characteristics:

<u>Prefix</u>: 548 <u>Code</u>: C942712

<u>Design</u>: "Thank You" written as one word in capital letters which are a fraction under 3mm high. An advertisment for Telecom Flexi-Plans appears on a white panel on the lowest fifth of the card.

Suspected varieties of this card are:

- 1. A card with an "A" (advertising) code and where the "Thank You" appears on the face of the card in large letters (well over 3mm tall).
- 2. A card which advertises a service other than Telecom Flexi-Plans in the white panel on the face of the card.

If anyone has either or both of the suspected varieties, please call me on (03) 9772 1950 or send me photocopies of the front and back of the card. I will send you a free phonecard worth at least \$2 to compensate for the cost of postage and photocopies.

Furthermore, I will correlate all information received and submit my findings to APM for publication for the benefit of all collectors.

Basically, the Telstra Corporation has entered into the market for **co-branded credit cards** in conjunction with the ANZ Bank and Visa International.

The Telstra Visa Card will operate on a points system, with points being awarded for every dollar spent at any merchant that accepts Visa. Whilst the rewards package includes discounts on a number of services and items as provided by companies participating, of specific interest to phonecard collectors is that the card doubles as a TeleCard allowing cardholders to make credit calls to anywhere in the world. This can be done from virtually any phone throughout Australia and from other countries back to Australia. Call costs will be charged back to the users home phone account.

Interestingly, the card can be used as a credit card without access to Telstra's TeleCard function. The card has its own number and if the TeleCard function is also applied for, the user is given a four digit TeleCard PIN code. The card number and PIN code are entered in payphones to enable calls to be made.

Whilst not a Remote Memory Telephone Card (not having a set pre-paid amount) it never-the-less may be considered by some to be classed as phonecard!



PayTel Australia will have all their current phonecards and packs available. Their Tilt Train card issue is nearly sold out but they hope to have some still available. They hope also, to have their next issue featuring Tropical Frogs at the fair, if production is completed on time. PayTel will also mount a special display featuring their past and current phonecard issues.

#### **INFORMATION TABLES**

A number of Australia's main hobby magazine publishers will have information tables at the fair including The Australasian Phonecard Monthly, Stamp News, Australian Coin Review and the International Bank Note Society.



# AUSTRALIA'S FIRST PHONECARD FANS ARE STILL COLLECTING

Are you quick to pick up a new trend before it becomes big news?

Four Phonecard collectors from NSW and the ACT saw the potential in Phonecard collecting back in 1990 and were the first people to register with the Phonecard Collector Service. Five years later they, together with more than 27,000 other Australians, are still collecting.

Their insight in getting involved with the fledgling hobby of Phonecard collecting has provided them with an unexpected bonus, which was witnessed by Viddy Jermacans, Editor of 'The Australasian Phonecard Monthly'. The Phonecard Collector Service rewarded the long term loyalty of its first members with a celebratory lunch and special Phonecard presentation on Thursday, 22nd June, 1995, at the Ramada Hotel, Parramatta.

The lucky four are incurable collectors, who boast almost complete Phonecard collections. Before the introduction of Phonecard, they collected stamps, coins, bank notes and even model cars.

For stamp collector Ron Warne. Phonecard was a breath of fresh air.

"I'd been getting fed up with stamp collecting - there were too many releases and the quality wasn't as good. As soon as I saw Phonecard I liked it and new it would be a great collectable. I now collect by prefix - it's all in the thrill of the chase," he said.

David Daw also saw the potential of Phonecard, although he was drawn to the possibility of collecting by theme.

"I'm very interested in Australian history, social change and transport and Phonecard provides me with plenty of opportunities to collect on these themes. I also liked the idea of collecting something created by modern technology. It really makes a difference to the quality of the cards - the printing and reproduction are excellent," he commented. Fellow collector Jim Lewin admits to being surprised at the success of Phonecard.

"Five years ago I didn't think it would take off like it has, but this new collectable has really taken people's interest, " he said.

While all four believe their collections are quite valuable, they agree that the investment potential is secondary to the pleasure they get from collecting. All are keen stalwarts of the Phonecard Collector Service which now has more than 27,000 members.

According to Emma Rogers from the Phonecard Collector Service, the drive to take up Phonecard collecting continues to gather momentum. "Our membership is still growing and with exciting issues such as our biennial design award issue and the popular Christmas series, we believe that Phonecard collecting will continue to be Australia's fastest growing hobby".

"Our members range from children, through teenagers to grandparents, with many enjoying phonecard collecting as a family hobby. We also work closely with dealers, many of whom represent Phonecard investors," she said.

Phonecard collecting has grown so quickly that many stamp and coin dealers have found a high proportion of their business is now based on Phonecard. One such dealer, Max Stern of Melbourne, saw the potential in Phonecard collecting at a very early stage. Commonly regarded as Australia's leading philatelic expert, he was one of the first businesses to acknowledge Phonecard as a legitimate collectable and start to deal in Phonecard.





# THE GRAPEVINE

### by Insider

Well, interesting developments are occurring in the Sydney area with it appearing that Telstra will possibly advance a new policy with regards to Custom card issue. But first, for some update information.

The **prefix numbers 386 and 387** reported to be of 3,000 and 7,000 print runs but never sighted, can now be revealed to be test runs designed to trial a new type of plastic. These cards were never released and now reside in Telstra's archives/warehouse. This gives more weight to grade the **502's** as test cards rather than standard prefix run cards.

The conjecture over the last few months with collectors and dealers alike trying to guess how many of Roam Australia's cards featuring the Middle East Peace and the World War II themes were released has finally been settled. Only 1,000 of each of the two sets were released to Roam for distribution, ie. 9,000 of each of the two 10,000 print runs are still being held by Telecom pending the outcome of legal proceedings instigated by Roam Australia. (See Australian News Update Section - Editor).

These cards now rate just behind the **one Australia Challenge** cards for **current** scarcity. They will represent excellent investment items for those who manage to obtain sets at (or near) issue price. The most conservative figure for the number of collectors in Australia based on any analysis is at least 7,000. Clearly supply will not equate demand and so the price will go up a long way over the medium to long term. Anyone wanting to get sets should do so early.

#### The question is asked often by individuals on the sideline:

#### "How reliable is a Telsta decision?"

Recent examples of how Telstra can cause problems lies in the **Victorian Prison** card release through dealers. These cards, stated Telstra, "will not be available outside the Victorian Prison system" - refer Australian Phonecard Bulletin No. 6., page 10. I considered myself lucky to get one of the \$5 cards (at somewhat more than \$5) until I found out that they were distributed to dealers by Sprintpak to re-sell to collectors!! If Telstra continue to make these sort of errors, perhaps they should find an alternate way of releasing cards so that collectors and dealers would again have confidence in buying and selling cards.

In fact, once the cards were available to the dealers they were passed on easily, quickly and cheaply to collectors so why not just automatically send them through the dealers to distribute?

An interesting aspect of this exercise is that mint \$5 Prison cards are readily available whilst used are not. This will lead to a situation whereby used cards will be 'worth' more than mint!!

I wonder if the \$10 Prison card will be released to dealers as was the \$5?

Related point:- The 'Thank You' cards of which 10,000 were printed have so far managed to remain quite scarce. How is this so? 10,000 is quite a lot and should be noticeable. Telstra obviously still have a number of them left in 'the safe'. I personally think that I have been 'quite nice' to Telstra over recent articles, putting forward a number of suggestions (as above) and feel that I deserve a big 'thank you'. So, if anyone at Parramatta is reading this article just send one to the Magazine c/- the Editor for attention of the Insider.

The card does not (contrary to strong rumours) exist in different forms or varieties. All cards are exactly the same! Apart from being sent out to clients, the cards also appear at newly opened Telstra agencies (usually) in shopping malls in major cities. Prices for these cards have reached \$150 in the past but should really be around the \$20 level. A large number (1,200) were recently released as 'give-aways' to the general public at a newly opened Telstra agency in Garema Arcade in Canberra. Ring around if you want a 'Thank You' card before buying!

The **one Australia Challenge** packs are moving up in price at a steady rate. They have gone past the \$500 mark now and reports are that two have sold above \$700 already. This is a case of non-speculator driven prices. The pack is moving because demand is outstripping supply and but for the subdued market compared to this time last year, this pack would have gone past the \$1,500 mark by now!!

The 502 \$5 Lifesaving cards continue to prove elusive, particularly in the mint variety. These continue to be two cards to 'watch out for'!

# FOCUS ON FARAWAY PLACES

This Month: LITHUANIA

Lithuania, a small independent nation in Europe, first issued telephone cards about 2 years ago.

The first card commemorated the visit of Pope John Paul II to the country in 1993.



The Papal visit was a momentous event for the predominantly Roman Catholic nation, since religious worship had been suppressed for many years while Lithuania was under Soviet domination (1944 to 1990).

The long and complex history of Lithuania is closely tied to shifts in power in Poland and Russia over the centuries. After the Bolshevik revolution Lithuania broke away from Russian domination. By 1940, however, Lithuania was so fearful of the aggressive stance of Hitler and the Third Reich that it formally requested to be incorporated into the U.S.S.R. for its own secuity.

On 3 August 1940, Lithuania was formally reincorporated into the U.S.S.R. Unfortunately, this move did not spare the country from German aggression; Hitler invaded both Lithuania and Russia in 1941. From 1941 to 1944 the country was under German occupation. By 1944 Germany was on the retreat in Eastern Europe and the U.S.S.R. re-occupied Lithuania for the next 46 years until the disintegration of the Soviet Union.

The national telephone company of Lithuania is known at Lietuvos Telekomas.

Chip cards of Russian manufacture were briefly trialled in Lithuania but not adopted. The publicissue cards are of the Italian type (with break off corner) by Urmet of Italy.

Lithuania appears to have adopted a conservative card issuing policy - only two further issues have appeared in the past year.

There has been a single 25 unit advertising card for the Vilniaus Bankas (Vilnius Bank) and a set of two cards picturing landmark buildings - a 50 unit card picturing the Karolina Hotel and a 200 unit card picturing Traku Pilis (Traku Castle).

The regular cards can all still be found without much difficulty, but the chip cards have all but dissapeared.





Polish Telephone Token

Now a thought came up. If Poland uses all bank notes for their currency, how do they make telephone calls? We were staying at a modern hotel in Warsaw, so I posed the question to the man at reception. "By using telephone tokens," he said. "Where do you buy these telephone tokens," I asked? From the local kiosk," was the reply.

So I was out in the streets again looking for a kiosk that sold **telephone tokens** to bring back as a souvenir. The tokens cost 1,200 Zloty which is about 8 cents and is cheap for a local call. However, I don't know whether there is a time limit made on each unit.

The best place to look for used phonecards in Poland is always the railway station. This is where travellers get off the train and use the cardphone to arrange accommodation for the night, or arrange for a friend to pick them up at the station. They are just sitting there on the shelf 'for the taking'!

#### **PAYPHONICS**

# AUSTRALIA'S FIRST PHONECARD OPERATED FACSIMILE SERVICE

Payphonics has announced the launch of Australia's first phonecard operated facsimile service. The service operated by Payphonics in Melbourne's Block Arcade, has been under test conditions for some time and was launched on 21 June 1995. Facsimile technology has been integrated with payphone technology to form a combination payphone and facsimile service.

Operating the service is easy. The user inserts the first A4 sheet (or smaller) containing the message to be transmitted, they then insert a phonecard, lift the handset and dial the destination facsimile machine telephone number. When the call is answered by the facsimile machine at the other end, the user presses a red button and the paper is automatically drawn into the machine. As each sheet is completed, a six second tone sounds allowing the user time to insert any additional sheets. Faxes can be sent to anywhere in the world!

The Australasian Phonecard Monthly was the second recipient of a fax sent as above; definately a Limited Edition fax sheet.

The fax service is already proving to be popular with local shop keepers and the public alike. According to Payphonics manager Craig Hamilton, the facsimile payphone is the latest in a series of technological innovations developed by the company. Payphonics also introduced the first hands-free payphone using phonecards as a means of payment. This service is intended in particular for people with disabilities that preclude them from holding a telephone handset.

One such installation is at Yooralla in Box Hill, Victoria. Payphonics, along with the Care Givers and the young people who reside there, are jointly working on the development of a general purpose telephone which allows a large percentage of people with motor skill deficiencies the freedom of making and conducting their own telephone call. Ordinarily a Care Giver has to perform these functions.

Due to the complexity of these designs, Craig says that Payphonics relatively small installed base of payphones is intentional, as the company is focussing on quality rather than quantity. A well planned and considered product development program is being followed and so we will see more payphones from Payphonics as time passes. As Craig was the principal engineer in charge of the introduction of phonecard technologies into Australia it will be very interesting to follow Payphonic's progress in the area of technical innovation.

## NEW ZEALAND NEWS UPDATE

### GLOBAL TELECOM ..... A new force in telecommunications

With the launch of Global Telecom Systems Ltd., the final stage in the establishment of a competitive New Zealand owned company offering a wide range of telecommunications services has been achieved.

Global in New Zealand is part of a network currently providing telecommunication services on four continents in the world. A strategic alliance between National Payphones and Paycell was the initial step towords the formation of this independant network (see February 1995 issue APM).

The new organisation aims to give New Zealanders a range of highly competitive services to reduce their telephone calling costs.

The first service will give savings on international calls through the use of the Global International Telephone Card. Global's gateway into New Zealand is the Auckland Earth Station providing the New Zealand company with the independence and flexibility of their own satellite link.

**Remote Memory Telephone Cards** 

Global, like many other overseas companies has joined the leading United States Telecommunications Giants in utilizing the Remote Memory card services. With Global Telecom, their cards can be accessed through over 1,000 touch tone telephones in New Zealand including Telecom Payphones.

**What is a Remote Memory Telephone Card?** 

Such a card is not a new concept and in fact currently more remote memory cards are produced around the world than most other technologies. The huge North American market is now 90% dominated by this technology.

A remote memory telephone card is a pre paid card which allows telephone calls to be made to the value pre paid. The main aspect of Global's card is that the monetary value of the card is not stored on the card but in a central Global exchange. As calls are made the Global central exchange changes the balance accordingly.

**Global's Collector Policy** 

Telephone card collecting around the world is a growing hobby. Last year New Zealand saw a remarkable boom, attracting tens of thousands of speculators that pushed up the market prices.

Global feels that these inflated prices took away the collectability of the telephone card from the hands of the majority due to the fact that an average person can not afford to obtain one of each card.

Global has indicated that it wishes to provide the collecting public with a quality product that is collectable and affordable. As such, the company will produce all cards in two styles.

Each card will be produced in a denomination of value applicable with the service provided, eg., \$5, \$10, \$20,

\$25, \$50, \$100 values but the same card design will be produced as a \$2.00 face value card. The \$2 card may be produced in a 'Collector', 'Bonus', 'Complimentary', 'Sample', 'Promotion', category depending on the product type.

The \$2 card will be produced to a photo graphic quality but on a lighter more flexible plastic. Similar lighter weight cards are produced in numerous countries around the world, for example, Australia and Japan. The lighter weight plastic will further distinguish the two types of cards.

This policy is intended to allow collectors to build substantial collections of quality and beauty but at a minimal cost.

Also in Global's collector policy it is intended that sufficient cards will be produced to provide at least one card to each collector on their standing order service, including dealer's standing orders.

Collector packaging premiums will be kept to a minimum with in most cases the additional charge being between \$10 - \$25.

**Inaugural Presentation Pack** 

The company's Inaugural Issue Collector's Presentation Pack has been produced strictly as a Limited Edition. Only 500 packs have been issued with the complete set of 4 cards. The pack which contains \$10, \$25, \$50 and \$100 cards (\$185 in face value) has an issue price of \$205.

In line with the policy as outlined above, the company has also issued an Inaugural Issue Collector's Presentation Pack which contains the set of four cards each bearing a face value of only \$2.00.

This Pack is available at an issue price of \$28 whilst individual cards are available at face value.

The Inaugural International Telephone Cards show Totaranui Beach in the heart of Abel Tasman National Park.

### FULLERS FERRIES SMARTCARD TELEPHONES

Auckland Fullers Ferries in association with National Payphones/Paycell have announced the introduction of a cellular smartcard payphone service commencing from June 1995.

This new service will allow ferry passengers the freedom to make telephone calls whilst commuting to their destinations. Calls can be made to all destinations in the world including all local and national calls.

A choice of payment has been provided with most vessels carrying a coin payphone and a smartcard payphone. The card payphone is utilising the latest technology smartcard telephone card that is unique to the Auckland Fullers telephones.

It is the first time that a private company has issued their own telephone cards and telephones in New Zealand.

It is intended that only 2-3 sets of cards will be issued each year utilising the smartcard technology.

# THE JAPANESE EXPERIENCE

#### (Part 7.) Cats and Dogs

What is the most popular thematic collectable on phonecards? Is it Coke, Disney or Trains? No, it is actually the humble cat! Fido comes a bit behind Felix, but is also a popular theme to collect.

The collecting of cats and dogs as a theme shows that not all popular themes from Japan are expensive or difficult to collect. This theme also appeals very strongly to the kids and especially girls. The majority of these cat related cards are produced on NTT cards so they are freely available at a cheap price. Cats are featured in a natural state as well as in a variety of contrived poses, such as stuffed into a cookie jar or gift box, or hanging from a washing line in a clothes bag! As if cats can't find enough unusual poses of their own!

Most designs are produced to fit the "cute and cuddly" description with the result that a page of attractive cats has


been known to make many a young lady emit strange sounds of "ooooh" or "I want them all"!

Dogs have been known on occasion to have the same effect but the particular dog needs to be really photogenic and

especially cuddly to get the same response from the ladies.

Private issue White or Free cards tend to be produced with cartoon cats rather than photographs of cats and generally feature an advertisment for some cat-related product such as a cat food brand or a cat exhibition. It is very easy to find a collection of cats from the cheaper NTT cards and at the same time the private issues allow the specialist to find rarer examples that have a particular appeal. Most dealers would have a range of the cheaper cats for around \$4 a card. The rarer ones are priced from \$6 to \$24. One particular set of 5 from Japan fit together as a 'jigsaw' and feature two kittens, both holding a ball of wool. This set is listed at \$450! Another set of 5 puzzle cards features a row of 26 kittens in a line - also priced at \$450!

In the Japanese Catalogue, 14 pages are devoted to Coca-Cola cards - nearly all of which are White or Free cards and so relatively expensive to obtain. Cats have 20 pages devoted to them and only a few of the NTT issues are shown which indicates that a large number of cat cards must exist. Dogs equal Coca-Cola with 14 pages!



# TELECOM AUSTRALIA PHONECARDS \*SERIAL NUMBERS LIST\* ISSN: 1324-2725

This publication includes, in five easy-to-follow sections, the serial numbers, or as they are known, the i.d. numbers or batch numbers, of all phonecards released by Telecom Australia or Telstra, that fit in the Australian numbering system up to number 864.

#### Introduction

This serial numbers list is made up of five different sections. The first section lists all phonecards that were available from Telecom or from retail outlets at face value. The only exceptions are the \$1.50 Christmas 1992 N920610a serial number 218 that was given free of charge to those who had bought phonecards through Telecom postal order service. The remaining Phonecards were made available for sale at \$6 each. The \$5 Geneva ICM-2 serial number 106, was initially released at Geneva, but the remaining cards were available from Telecom at face value. It also lists the \$2 Complimentary cards released from 1995.

The other sections list Special Issues, Limited Editions, Custom Phonecards and finally International Phonecards manufactured for Telstra for use in overseas countries, and whose serial numbers range within the Australian phonecards serial numbering.

To the best of our knowledge, these serial numbers are accurate at the time of printing.

The serial number range is larger than the print run to allow for errors in all serial numbers to 121 and from 127 to 130. For serial numbers 122 to 126 and then from 131 the print run is equal to the serial number range.

Seven cards have a serial number range of only 600 cards and the same cards a further 100,000. They come from uninterrupted print runs of 100,000 cards spanning two serial numbers. The total range for these cards is thus 100,600 allowing for 600 errors, as was normal practice when these cards were produced. It is therefore impossible to state that the print runs are

actuallyy 600 and 100,000. A percentage of the 600 errors must obviously be deducted from these numbers. In serial number 284, \$20 Generic G930134a, the word Copyright is missing on some cards. It is extremely difficult to establish how many cards exist with the word Copyright missing. However, we can give you some idea with the aid of the serial numbers we have seen: lowest serial number with Copyright 28406977, highest 28487887: lowest without Copyright 28489154, highest 28493035: lowest with Copyright 28497097, highest 28407098. On the basis of these numbers, no more than 9,210 phonecards without Copyright are in existance. But of course we have not seen all cards! In the first section, all print runs under 50,000 have been printed in **bold** typeface for easy identification. **Happy Collecting!**

#### **PayTel's New Satellite Payphone**

The primary feature of PayTel's new satellite payphone is that their service now extends right over the whole of the Australian continent - well beyond the limitations of the cellular radio network.

A number of "outback Australian" transport operators and others have been waiting many years for the provision of mobile payphone services - and the new PayTel product is designed to meet these needs.

The first trial of this new product will be on board Australian National's trans-Australian 'Indian Pacific' passenger train. This train operates on one of the longest rail routes in the world and travels across some of the most arid country on earth. The 5 day full journey commences in Sydney on the Eastern seaboard and finishes in Perth on the western seaboard.

The payphone is fitted with two communication interfaces - one for Telecom's cellular network and one for the Optus "B" satellite. When the train is within cellular radio range, the payphone connects calls through this network. The satellite interface is automatically connected when the train moves outside cellular range.

It will be of **interest to collectors** to note that the development of this system has precipitated the change from phonecards displaying simply a \$ 'face' value to the new value descriptor of \$ face value + number of units encoded.

PayTel's satellite payphone provides local (Australia wide) calls on both cellular and satellite - at different call charges/minute + full ISD call capabilities on both cellular & satellite - again with different call charges for each system to each different group of ISD destinations!!

The new cards are encoded with a number of 25c units, eg. a \$5 card is encoded with 20 units. When a user enters a number to be called and swipes a phonecard through the card reader - the payphone computes the number of minutes of call time from the card credit (in call units) and call destination - and displays this 'credit' in minutes of call time available for the call being made.

Minutes of call time credit is undated as the call proceeds and when the call is complete, the display shows the number of call units credit remaining on the card.

This form of 'user interface' is unique to PayTel, who have developed this system in response to surveys carried out on a number of payphone installations throughout Australia. These clearly indicate that the two sets of information most required by payphone users are:

(a) "I want to be able to calculate the approximate time available on my card if I dial....", and

(b) "I want to know the exact number of minutes (call time credit) remaining as I am making a call - not a \$ value". PayTel have dubbed it the TRD feature - Time Remaining Display!

PayTel believes that this TRD feature provides the user with the real information he/she wants to know as a call is being made and makes the payphone and phonecards much more 'user friendly.

My thanks to Graham Rooke for provision of the above information. Where will this (locally developed) technology end? - Editor.

#### **KAZAKHSTAN**

Recently, the republic of Kazahkstan has begun to issue phonecards. This country is a state in the centre of the Eurasian continent with a population of around 17 million made up from some 120 different nationalities, the majority of whom are Kazakhs and Russians. For administration purposes Kazahkstan is divided into 19 Regions under the control of the central government.

Satel (the Republic of Kazakhstan's Telecommunications Authority) is working in conjunction with Telsra of Australia in a joint venture to set up a telephone payphone system. The first phones were installed in May 1995.

To date, **22 phones have been installed** in hotels, restaurants, casinos and at the airport of the capital. The payphone facilities/technology is aimed at the international market as the expense for Kazakhs is high.

The first issue consists of 4 cards with denominations in US\$ of \$5, \$10, \$20 and \$50. 20,000 are printed for each denomination and each collector pack will contain one of each of the 4 cards (cards featured on page 8).

The phonecards are produced by Alcatel in Belgium and they **feature two magnetic stripes**. After each card is used a (large) punch hole is made on the stripe/s to indicate whether the card has been used once or twice. Each card can only be used twice.

5,000 Collector Packs are to be produced in one format from Czechoslovakia and a further 5,000 packs are to be produced in a different format from Pakistan. These Collector Packs will be sold through tourist venues in the country as souvenirs for people visiting.

The authorities will also be packaging used cards for sale as well as the mint cards!

#### MADAGASCAR

The island of Madagascar has just issued its first phonecards. Cards are of 25, 50 and 100 units respectively and are issued by **STELMAD** (Societe des telecommunications de Madagascar) and manufactured by Schlumberger of France. Public telephones are apparently found only in Antananarivo and the level of usage is low. Most locals are too poor to afford to use phonecards.

A word of caution: STELMAD is not geared up to supplying cards by mail order. If you take the risk of attempting to order cards, you may never receive a reply or a refund of your money!!
