EDITORIAL

The next two issues of APM will have slightly amended production and distribution dates.

The December '95 issue is to be published earlier than normal due to my visit to Jakarta from 29 November to 5 December, whilst the January '95 issue will not be distributed until late in the second week of January - due to the Christmas/New Year period.

As such, advertisers, contributors, etc. should note the revised deadlines for receipt of material. I will be operating on a very tight schedule for the December issue in particular!

The September '95 issue of APM contained details of major amendments to Telstra's Phonecard issuing policy. My Editorial commented on this policy.

This issue contains details re the expansion of PayTel Australia's phonecard issuing policy.

PayTel has introduced two new categories of phonecards; firstly, Advertising cards and secondly, Network Access Permit cards. Guidelines for the two are at page 4.

In relation to the Advertising cards, it appears that two 'groups' will have an interest in this category, ie. advertisers and phonecard collectors.

Due to the nature of PayTel's present payphone network - located on and associated with, trains, ferries, cruise ships - I see a specific category of advertiser being PayTel's main client, ie., one associated with the travel and tourist industry, wishing to promote an 'exciting' service or product.

This should lead to some colourful and varied cards becoming available to collectors - if they can access them, particularly as they are complimentary only.

The Network Access Permit phonecards appear to be a little more 'complicated' than the Advertising category. I say this, as I see two 'varieties' of phonecards being produced under this policy.

In the first example, an organisation (eg. The Cairns Tourist Assoc.) obtains a permit from PayTel to produce phonecards (in 'large' numbers) for sale to passengers, booking to travel on the 'Sunlander' to Brisbane.

The Assoc. would promote their service on the card as well as obtain revenue from travellers from the sale of cards, at face value. They may not even know that phonecard collectors exist!

In the second example, an organisation obtains a permit from PayTel to produce (Limited Edition) phonecards, specifically for collectors, at a mark-up over face value.

It can be seen that the two new categories of phonecard will provide a number of challenges to the collector and as such, the collector will need to ascertain (again), what to collect and what not to collect.

As both the Advertising and the NAP cards are encoded for use in any of PayTel's payphones (within their national system), there is no doubt as to their legitimacy as to being Australian phonecards.

Until now, collectors of 'one of everything' of PayTel's cards have found it easy to do so, based on limited (in number) issues, minor mark-ups above face value and an ability to access cards direct from PayTel or from dealers. Whilst this will now change, the increase in the distribution of PayTel's phonecards nationally, will undoubtally attract further users and collectors, which should benefit all invoved, both from a collector and a commercial perspective.

As a final comment, I personally, as would I am sure, the majority of collectors and dealers, like to see cards within the new categories' being individually numbered.

EXPANSION OF PAYTEL AUSTRALIA'S ISSUING POLICY

In line with recent developments in types of phonecards issued, PayTel Australia has decided to expand its own issuing policy. PayTel has now established its own 'flavour' in the production of cards illustrating Transport, Heritage and other aspects of 'Australiana'. However, there are many other popular themes which do not fit into PayTel's own criteria. The expansion of PayTel's issuing policy is designed to expand the range of card themes available to collectors.

The first stage of this expansion sees two new categories of cards produced by PayTel - these are **Advertising** cards and **Network Access Permit** cards.

Neither of these card categories will be available direct from PayTel (note exception below) nor will the acquisition of these cards contribute towards *Collector's Club* points. (Advertising cards produced to promote PayTel products and/or services will be complimentary cards distributed by PayTel).

PayTel's own cards and packs will continue to be issued as usual and will be available direct from PayTel.

Advertising Cards

PayTel Advertising phonecards are commissioned by a person or organisation to promote a specific product or service. They are complimentary cards and will be made available free-of-charge in response to some action, such as the purchase of the specific product(s) or service(s) advertised.

They will not be available for direct purchase from the advertiser.

They will not be available from PayTel, with the exception of those cards which advertise PayTel products and/or services.

There are strict criteria attached to the production of PayTel Advertising cards:

Advertising cards are complimentary only.

. They may not be sold by the person or organisation who orders them from PayTel.

• Each card displays the statement "This is a PayTel Complimentary card".

- The cards are produced by PayTel and will display a special PayTel logo: PayTel Advertising phonecard.
- All Advertising cards are \$3 face value, and are produced only in 2,000 or 3,000 runs.

• Advertising cards will carry a Control Code starting with A.

. All Advertising cards are encoded for use in all PayTel payphones.

PayTel's Network Access Permit (NAP) cards

PayTel NAP cards are phonecards produced for an organisation which has applied for and has been granted a PayTel Network Access Permit.

Under the NAP scheme and within PayTel's guidelines, the permit holder determines the card theme and provides the card images for reproduction.

NAP cards produced under this scheme bear the organisation's name, NAP number, logo and designs.

The cards do not display the PayTel logo.

The cards are available from the NAP holder. They will not be available from PayTel.

The NAP scheme has been partly derived from PayTel's association with the Australian railway network. The standardised guage rail system now extending from Brisbane through Sydney and Melbourne to Adelaide and Perth, will soon come under government control in the form of Track Australia (TA). The aim of TA is to provide open access on equitable terms to allcomers - in the hope of encouraging new private ventures in operating rail services over the TA network.

PayTel's NAP scheme has identical aims - to encourage organisations to produce their own phonecard releases, using an established payphone network, for the benefit of all phonecard collectors. The advent of the PayTel NAP scheme will certainly provide a new avenue for the production of a wide range of individual card designs and themes.

The following points summarise the features of PayTel's Network Access Permit scheme:

- . NAP cards are only produced for organisations which have applied for and been granted a PayTel NAP.
- . All NAP cards display the permit holder's name and logo.

. The PayTel logo does not appear on NAP cards.


- Each card displays the statement, "This product operates on the PayTel national payphone network and is permitted under PayTel's Network Access Permit number NAPxxx".
- . NAP cards will be marketed by the permit holder.
- . NAP cards will not be available from PayTel.
- NAP cards will carry a Control Code starting with NAPxxx.
- . All NAP cards are encoded for use in all PayTel payphones.

The PHANTOM

The Phantom is the world's oldest superhero. He pre-dates Superman by about three months. The difference being that Superman (Batman, et al) are comic book heroes, whilst the Phantom is a comic strip hero, existing only in syndicated newspaper strips.

The comic books that are published here in Australia are collections of strips that originally appeared in American newspapers - with the exception of the occasional Swedish story. Semic, a Swedish publisher, began commissioning original Phantom stories in the late '50's, to keep up with their hectic schedule of weekly Phantom comic books.

Frew, the Australian publisher, sometimes reprints these stories.

Frew has also produced three of its own original stories, all written by Frew's owner and director, Jim Sheperd, and illustrated by the late Keith Chatto. A fourth story, illustrated by Glenn Ford, is due out early next year.

Semic are still the leading publishers of the Phantom in the world, with a circulation of approximately 90,000 throughout Scandanavia, Russia and Czechoslovakia. Frew has a circulation of approximately 50,000, more impressively in only two countries - Australia and New Zealand.

The Phantom is also published in South America, Italy, Spain, India and Thailand.

As the circulation of the Australian comic indicates, there are a lot of Phantom fans in this country. Phantom collectables are met with ravenous enthusiasm.

The comics themseleves, as back issues, command huge prices. A No. 1 issue recently sold at an auction for \$3,500 in fine to near mint condition. Other collectables such as rings, badges, 70's paperback novels, 60's board games and model kits, etc., are in constant demand.

In 1993, Dynamic Marketing, in conjunction with the Phantom Zone, introduced the world's first Phantom Trading Card series. Distributed only in Australia and New Zealand, they were an instant success and sold out within a month. The second series, released a year later and produced in larger quantities, sold out quickly as well.

The Phantom Zone, in collaboration with Fantasy Phonecards, are releasing their first Phantom Phonecard in late November, 1995. All indications are that this will be an instant sellout. Only 5,000 are being produced - compare this with 10,000 of the first Phantom Trading Card series - which will undoubtably be snapped up by Phantom collectors just as quickly.

A Phantom phonecard was produced in Germany a few years ago and now fetches \$100 loose.

The Australian phonecard is packaged with a two page comic book, written and illustrated by Glen Ford. Glen is the "official Australian Phantom artist". He designed the two Trading Card series for Dynamic Marketing, as well as Phantom T-Shirts, posters, diaries, neckties and covers for the comic.

Each phonecard package will be numbered and signed by Glen.

There will be no loose phonecards available - all 5000 cards can only be purchased as a package.

THE GRAPEVINE

by Insider

'Forgeries & other Nasties'

Last month's article focussed on how to make or lose money producing custom cards. This month's, explains how some have tried to make money by producing forged cards.

It was quite a while ago since my first article appeared on the scene back in April 1994. In that article, I talked about overprints and the dangers to our hobby if that sort of 'card' ever gained favour in the eyes of collectors. History has shown that these dubious 'issues' lasted all of ten seconds on the phonecard scene and probably made little, if any, money for the instigators of the cards.

We in the hobby are now under an even greater threat from some new entrepreneurial activities.

As has occured in the early days of stamp production, dubious individuals seized the opportunity to manufacture stamps from non-existent countries, or just plain forged stamps from real countries, safe in the knowledge that in the new hobby collectors were lacking in basic information and would not have any written information about the status of these stamps.

It was in this vacuum of information that the bogus producer got away with selling the fake products to collectors. This very same situation is now occurring with our hobby in some areas.

Forged Cards

Chip cards can be forged by planting a real computer chip inside a blank card. These blanks are easily manufactured and it is an easy task to fit the chip to the blank card. As long as no money value is added to the card, or that the card is not able to be inserted into a payphone, the producer 'is laughing'!

How to ensure the card does not get put into a phone or 'tested' for value? Simple, just make a card for a country unlikely to bother to catch you or one which would be unlikely to even hear of the forged card.

Let me see, how about making a card for Russia - after all - no one will go to Russia to use the card and no phones exist anyway, so a purchaser would be unlikely to find out about this ruse!

It is fairly common knowledge, that some well known Coca-Cola phonecards are fakes! The so called Coca-Cola cards from Bylo-Russia featuring Mickey Mouse and the Dynamic Ribbon motif, are faked. These cards are not produced in Russia, do not work in phones in Russia and have no one admitting to making them!

Actually, if one compares the real cards from Russia (poor quality designs and manufacture), it is hard to believe that the faked cards (top quality design and manufacture with real good chips) are any more than unreal!

Refer to the article and pictures in an earlier magazine article by Ken Hosking - April 1995 - to see what I mean.

Another pair of faked cards are the two Eastern European, featuring vending machines and the red and green backs to the cards. Again, cards that can not be used and for whom no one admits to being the manufacturer! It appears that these cards are produced somewhere in the Belgium/France area.

Forging magnetic strip cards is just as easy. Obtain the magnetic strip in rolls and stick it on to blank cards you have printed. Same as before, the collector/purchaser has to find a phone (usually in another country) to be able to confirm that the card is encoded and as such, is not a forgery.

Numbers

Most of the forged cards identified to date, have been promoted as being of a 'Limited Issue' in nature. Coincidentally also, they have no numbers or coding to identify or confirm print run numbers. The promotion of a 'Limited Issue' attracts collectors, whilst a non-auditable print run leaves scope for unscrupulous producers to continue the production to suit the demand!

Concerns

The increased discovery and identification of such instances of apparent forgery as described above, leads to concern amongst the collector fraternity. Whilst many collectors obtain cards by theme, with the country of source being of a secondary nature, their ultimate assumption is that they are purchasing a genuine phonecard and not a piece of cardboard with a pretty (in some cases not) picture on it!

On realisation, that what they have purchased is not a genuine article, can only lead to firstly, disenchantment with the supplier of the article (if he/she can be identified) and secondly, with the hobby. The second, is the main concern! As such, collectors need to ascertain the status of not only the phonecards they are purchasing, but also of the promoter/producer of these cards.

Tourism NSW - Complimentary Issue

The **'Ken Done'** set of three are being issued to International travellers at Sydney airport - as from 8 October. Prefix numbers are 668, 669 and 670. Telstra advised on 27 Oct. that 54,000 of each of the three cards were printed and issued.

Australian Conservation Foundation - Custom

10,000 of each of the two \$5 cards were printed - the **Red-Tailed Black Cockatoo** (prefix no. 720) and the **'World View'** (prefix no. 721).

JERSEY TELECOMS

The island of Jersey is the largest of the Channel Islands (117 sq km), located 24 km from the Normandy coast, off France.

The inhabitants, approximately 75,000 in number, are mostly of Norman descent; English, French (the official language) and a Norman dialect are spoken. Whilst the island has formal links with the United Kingdom, it is self governed and has its own laws.

Phonecards were first issued in Jersey in mid 1988 (being **GPT magnetic cards**), with a lapse in issues between the first and the second, in March 1990.

From then onwards, **Jersey Telecoms** has issued 5-7 sets of phonecards each year.

The early issues were extremely colourful, the sets featuring local views, castles, steam locomotives, wildlife preservation, churches and lighthouses.



A later phonecard issue in 1994, combined the sport of sailing with the scene of Corbiere lighthouse in the background - the result being a card which would be of interest to any number of thematic collectors with differing tastes!

It was not until mid 1994 also, that Jersey Telecoms released a phonecard which featured the animal with which most of us associate

the name of Jersey - the Jersey breed of dairy cattle. This animal, native to the island, is depicted with a rather baleful gaze, on a 5 pound phonecard.



During 1995, Jersey Telecoms will be issuing a total of eight sets of phonecards.

In March, the first of Telecoms 'Presentation Edition' and 'Premiere Collection' presentation packs were released (at the Telecoms '95 exhibition), featuring illustrations of four rare birds that live on Jersey.

This 'Presentation Edition' had a limited print run of 1000 and the pack's four phonecards were attached by

tape to a cardboard information sheet and housed in a CD type, hard, plastic case.

The 'Premiere Collection' had a limited print run of 300, with each set again numbered and housed in an attractive storage case.

The issue price for the respective sets was 20 and 54 pounds, a low price for such a limited number.


1995 was also notable for being the anniversary of two key events in the islands history, namely the Centenary of the introduction of the telephone service to Jersey (which was started by the National Telephone Company in 1895) and the 50th anniversary of the Liberation of Jersey, following VE Day, on 9 May 1945.

The second 'Presentation Edition' and 'Premiere Collection' contained five phonecards produced to celebrate 100 Years of Telecommunications in Jersey. Twelve cards, depicting scenes from the German occupation, each associated with one of the twelve different parishes of Jersey, were produced to commemorate the liberation of the island in 1945.



Wheras the issues of the first few years issued by Jersey were predominantly 'scenery orientated', the issues in 1995 have been a 'mixture' of themes.

Apart from the three issues already mentioned, Issue No. 6 featured the Jersey Emergency Services (Abulance, Fire and Police),



whilst Issue No. 5 did feature scenery from the 'South East Coast of Jersey'.

The World of Coca-Cola Phonecards

Part 1. by Don Hill

To date, Coca-Cola phonecards have been produced in over 17 countries and as a thematic collectable they rank as number one in terms of profile. Coca-Cola cards will continue to be sought after as it is possible to obtain all cards produced and to keep up with the future new issues.

Since the beginning of 1995 the frequency of Coke issues world-wide has increased considerably. No longer will it be difficult to find cheap, easily obtainable Coca-Cola motif phonecards. Many have realised the enormous interest in this theme and Bottling Companies as well as licensed phonecards are now going to emerge regularly from many countries and Telecoms.

Early Coke Issues

The early pre-end 1993 Coke card issues were generally released with smaller numbers and as collector interest was, at that stage, in its early teens, these cards have appreciated considerably in price. It is recommended that serious collectors of Coke cards address the issues of that period as it is our belief that prices will continue to rise.

The Swiss Coke card for example, issued with a print run of 1500, sells for over \$3,000 an example of small issue quantity and early release, combining to produce a strong value in the secondary market.

The World of Coke Cards

We in Australia are blessed with a steady stream of easily affordable, locally produced, Coca-Cola phonecards and so it is easy to begin a collection just looking at the Australian issues.

To date, most countries which have issued Coke cards have done so in limited numbers. Japan has issued by far the most, with over 500 cards in the last 13 years. The United States has rapidly become the second most prolific card issuer with quite a few cards being released from 1994 onwards, whilst Germany, until recently in third place, has been by-passed by Australia since Card Phone issued the huge 16 card AFL series.

For an earlier article on Japanese Coca-Cola phonecards see issue No. 5, May 1995 of APM.

Coke Issues of Germany

This first article will focus on the German Coke cards. This country is considered by all to be the birthplace for the collecting of Coke cards as a theme and Germany has itself issued 31 phonecards to date. All but two of the German issues are reproduced in this article.

There are two types of German phonecards which feature Coke - the "O" and "K" series. The "O" series and the "K" series are both produced by Telecom for private issuers but the "K" series have 1000 copies which are sold through Telecom to the collector body.

The first German Coke card (ill. 1.) was issued in December 1992, with a release quantity of only 2000.

This card, called 'Getranke Mayer', features a Janet Jackson look-alike in the photo and so represents an added interest to collectors who may like to pretend it really is Janet herself - who knows, it may actually be her!!

Four Drinks

The next issue was a nice set of 4 cards (ill. 2-5.) featuring the four drinks - Fanta Light, Spright Light, CC Light and CC Light-Cafeine Free. A circulation of 3100 cards for this set makes it one to add to the collection sooner rather than later!

At 2b. is the reverse of the Fanta Light card and features the **Dynamic Ribbon** associated with Coca-Cola.

Always Partners

The third Coke issue was the first "O" series card to be released (ill. 6.) and it has a print run of 20,000. This card features the Coke bottle top and logo 'Always Partners'.

Basketball

The European Men's Basketball Championship (ill. 7.), which was held in the Olympic Hall in Munich, was issued with a special sponsored card in July 1993. The circulation was 3000.

Drink Labels

A nice set of cards featuring drink names (ill. 8-13.) was issued in 1993, with a quantity of 3100.

All the cards in the above list (except for the Getranke Mayer and Basketball cards) feature the Dynamic Ribbon and Coca-Cola on the rear of the card and have printed beneath the logo, the words (in German of course), "with the kind approval of Coca-Cola (headquarter) in Essen". The cards (ill. 2-5, 6, 8-13, 19, the two unshown cards,

The cards (ill. 2-5, 6, 8-13, 19, the two unshown cards, 21-26 and 27) are all the 'best of the best'.

My definition of the 'best of the best' lies in the fact that these cards were produced by Coca-Cola as promotional cards. The next best are officially licensed cards and the third category are cards which 'accidentally' bear the coke logo, etc.

Musicians

In late 1993, a set of three cards featuring musicians drinking Coke were released with a print run of 5000 (ill. 14-16.) - 1500 were made into a collector pack and the cards again feature the Dynamic Ribbon on the rear of each one.

Koln Festival Cards

The first card for 1994 (ill. 17.), was produced for the Koln Festival and it features a clown driving a cartoon car, drinking you know what! On the reverse of the card, three real people dressed up like Christmas crackers are featured in front of a view over Koln.

Interestingly, the manufacture date as shown on the card is listed as 1993! A quantity of 10,000 were released for the carnival and each card came in a colourful designed paper bag which fits snuggly over the card.

The next year saw the issue of a second Koln card, this time featuring a clown blowing hearts to a bottle of Coke on one side and on the other (ill. 18.), a clown dressed in flags of the world holding a world globe with a smiling face. This time only 4,000 were released in a folder.

Both of these issues are still available at a cheap price so they are obtainable for one's collection quite easily.

World Cup Soccer

A special, single card was released in 1994 (ill. 19.) in honour of the Soccer World Cup USA '94 event. This card features a cartoon dog and the rear of the card features a nice rendition of the normal Dynamic Ribbon design with a soccer ball whizzing across the screen!



A total of 14,000 cards were produced but due to the universal appeal of the soccer/Coke theme, this card is more difficult to obtain.

Coke Bottles

The next two issues (not shown) are an 8000 issue with each card featuring different Coke bottles.

Polar Bear Card

The next issue (ill. 20.) will be recognised by all Australian collectors as the design is almost identical to the first Australian Polar Bear card.

This card is labelled 'issue 2', being the second Karstadt issue, but is in fact the first Coca-Cola issue from Karstadt (!) and was issued in a run of 25,000.

The rear of the card features Asia Point Karstadt restaurant and comes with a small folder.




Jigsaw Set

I like the next set issued, best of all the German cards (ill. 21-26.). This set of six cards, each show a different 'oldie worldie' picture of traditional Coke designs and when placed together, the rear of the cards make a jigsaw picture of the 'Hand Holding the Coke Bottle'.

7600 sets were released in folders and this is the nicest jigsaw set I have seen - its destined to be a classic!


Always Music

In early 1995, 3300 of the Headphones/Bottles card were released. The motif on the card says "Always Music".



Music Festival

In 1995, Koln was the beneficiary of another card. This time the card featured the "Music Festival".



The rear of the card shows a man from the '60s with long hair and a bunch of flowers. This card features as my least liked German card and comes with an issue of 3000 in a small folder.

Hologram Card

Just as I was writing this article, I received news of the first German Hologram card (not shown due to the difficulties in photographing hologram cards), which features lots and lots of Coke bottles in a line. This card also comes in a small folder with a print run of 3300.

Next month I will look at the Coca-Cola phonecards produced by the other European countries.

The **PHONECARDS** of DENMARK

A Report by John Kruger

Phonecards were first introduced in Denmark in 1983, and have undergone several styling and production changes since then, to arrive at the very colourful renditions in use today.

All cards have a wealth of information printed on the reverse, including:- Production Company, Catalogue Number, Date to be Withdrawn from sale, and the initial Release Date. Some issues even have the production run total included, when they are special or limited release issues.

There are four companies in Denmark which are the official issuers of phonecards on behalf of the parent company - TELEDANMARK.

The largest of these is KTAS;

- KOBENHAVN TELEFONSELSSKAB A/S (Copenhagen Telephone Company) and the area of card sales is Seeland.

The next in size is **JTAS**:

- JYDSK TELEFONSELSSKAB A/S (Jutland Telephone Company) and the area of sale is North and Middle Jutland.

Third in size is FTAS:

- FYNS TELEFONSELSSKAB A/S (Funens Telephone Company) and the area of sales is Funen.

The smallest in size is **TSAS**; TELE SONDERJYLLAND A/S and the area of sale is South Jutland.

The first number on the reverse of a Danish phonecard, is the 'Lobenr", which is the number of the company which produced that particular card: No 1 = KTAS; No 2 = JTAS; No 3 = FTAS; No 4 = TSAS:

The numbers can readily be seen on the four cards pictured in the opposite column, together with the "Kat.nr.", which is the catalogue number, and also serves to identify the production company.

"Udlobsdato" is the date of validity - or withdrawal date - whilst the "Trykdato" is the date of release for sale.

Each card has exactly the same face, with no change whatsoever to identify the production company (only the Lobenr and Kat.nr. on the reverse).

TELEDANMARK also recognises the popularity of phonecard collecting and has recently released a special card entitled "Saml Selv ...!", which translates as "Save Yourself ...!", to further boost this fast growing hobby (see opposite).



Chip Cards

Another interesting release is a 'jigsaw pair', from two different companies working in concert with each other, with both cards being produced by KTAS to introduce the new 'Danmont Calling System', which was introduced in Copenhagen in December 1993.

The KTAS card uses the proven TELEDANMARK system and is used in the TELEDANMARK phones, whilst the Danmont card is of the 'smart card' or chip variety and is for use only in selected phone booths provided by the Danmont company.

It is interesting to note that the KTAS card has 'lost' the 'blind notch' on this issue).

Featured opposite also, is the humourous Definitive set which promotes the use of phonecards and uses catchy phrases to stick in the mind, eg. the shark card " If you hate to be interrupted", the kangaroo card, "If you are short of change", etc.























DON'T FORGET TO PHONE HOME! by Ken Hosking

Our youngest son, Phillip, has been infected by the 'travel bug' from his parents.

In January this year he packed his bag for his second world trip and we saw him off at the airport. He had an airline ticket to take him to London and a Eurail pass to see the cities in Europe. "See you next January", he said as he walked towards the door of no return. "Don't forget to phone home," his mother said, as he pushed open the door. Not long after he left, we received our first telephone call from him, using a phonecard from Scotland. The call lasted for about one minute and it just wasn't long enough because we had so many questions.

I then realised that this telephone call came out of his limited budget and that was why it was so short - because he

was paying!

Around that time Telstra were promoting their pre paid calling card, Phone Australia. I invested in a \$50 card. It wasn't necessary to send the card to him, but only the information about this card! So, I sent to him in the mail the instructions, countries where it could be used and the relevant access codes. On the back of the card, it has the card number and PIN. There are twenty countries in the world where the card can be used, but in Europe, it can only be used in Austria, Belgium, France, Germany, Italy and the United Kingdom. There is no access from the Scandanavian countries.

It's amazing how regular the calls are now, and you can tell that I am paying because he 'talks forever'.

Some additional information

- An indication is given to the caller on how much credit is left on the card before the call is connected.
- The cards are valid for three years from the date of first issue.
- The cost of a call from Europe varies from \$7.00 to \$9.00 for a five minute call.

- Be careful when dialling your number, because you could be dialling up to 30 numbers to get a telephone number

in Australia.







Finally

Telstra appear to have undertaken a good marketing strategy with overseas collectors, because they 'all' include the three Phone Australia cards on their want lists and don't seem to realise that they are not cards that are used in Australia itself!

Dear Sir,

I would not be surprised to find that many of today's phonecard collectors have been philatelists in the past and have been attracted to phonecards by their size, design and affordability.

Collectors of stamps issued prior to the 70's have the choice of immersing themselves in the fascinating realms of watermark variations, perforation size, ink shades, printing methods and so on, with costs related to the relevant scarcity of the various combinations.

Later, the dissapointments of 'modern' collectors were enhanced by the confusion over the various varieties and the necessary equipment to detect the multitude of different experiments by the major postal authorities.

Then came the 'new' countries, issuing sets of pretty stamps of useless denominations, flooding the collector market with standing order facilities to enable collectors to have a complete collection from the start of the new issuing authoritie's activities.

Then came the missing phosphor, slipped colour, wrong perforations, inverted watermarks, etc., which were announced after being supplied to dealers and which standing order customers were unable to obtain. We all know what happened next

Except for the earliest issues and experiments with new technology, all phonecard designs in Australia have been issued in quantities which satisfy collector demand and the smaller runs of Custom cards are advertised well in advance, so as to be accessed by interested collectors at the time of issue. The occassional 'error' does come to light and cannot be construed as being deliberately contrived to extract more funds from collectors.

Telsta's policy ensures that no limited short runs are printed by private producers at this stage. The shortages will occur in the future as more collectors enter the arena looking for older issues. Even the dedicated prefix collector can find most cards at reasonable prices in the used category.

As for back issues, the future new-comer can choose to narrow their interest to original logo, 1993 logo change, 1995 Telstra logo and eventually to chip/smart cards and multi-purpose cards, or a combination as well as an ever widening thematic selection.

Phonecards issued by service suppliers other than Telstra will not be so easy to procur. With some print runs and a high proportion being snapped up by collectors of mint and collector packs, there will be very few used cards

available on the market. Indeed, used examples will be unlikely to cost less than the mint cards.

Now, supposing Telstra decides to 'put the cat amongst the pigeons' by following the example of NTT with its 'white cards'.

Might we see organisations such as tourist boards having local attractions printed on \$5 cards for limited sale in their vicinity and various companies giving away \$2 complimentary cards in small quantities to their customers as 'freebies'?

The possibilities are endless of course, but unlikely. Overall, I'd suggest the future looks both bright for those who wish to enjoy a sensible collecting hobby without the manufactured surprises experienced by philatelists in the past.

The PhoneCard EXPLOSION 'Where are we Going?'

Many people involved in the phonecard business had hoped that the excesses of 1994 would lead to a gradual maturing of the New Zealand market. This is happening to some extent, the market is more fragmented than it was previously and some small sections have leapt ahead in growth and development!

However, the mainstream of the market appears to be heading down the path of more and more fancy packaging rather than focusing on the merit or otherwise of individual cards.

The primary market appears to be capable of absorbing 1500 to 3000 packs or folders without a hiccup. Telecom have recently issued details of 30 or so recent or new issues. The cards have a face value of over \$350, but to buy them all in their various formats will probably cost around \$1500. Currently, about half a million dollars a month is being spent on new issues from Telecom and dealers working the mail order market.

Over the course of a year this amounts to a lot of moneyover two or three years many individuals are going to spend \$5000 to \$10000 on new issues. Thus Telecom PhoneCard collecting becomes a very expensive hobby. Hence few people are actually collecting phonecards!

In New Zealand at the moment, we have a lot of PhoneCard buyers, some phonecard collectors and some phonecard investors. The main group of buyers active in the market are absorbing nearly every card that can be dreamt up by very clever marketing teams.

Over the years the Franklin Mint have produced a wide range of bits and pieces that can be found in thousands of homes throughout New Zealand. Has anyone noticed a vibrant collecting market dealing in their products? Is there a strong secondary market? The answer is **no**, because they are just 'pretty things'.

It can be argued that the mainstream of collecting PhoneCards is heading in the same direction. Many PhoneCards are being produced and purchased but it is not because they are pretty, it is because the main group of current purchasers believe they are eventually going to make a lot of money out of them.

If one wishes to make money out of collecting, it requires a few **investment skills**. The 'buy one of everything' approach will produce the odd item that will be a 'winner', but the main body of such a collection has little merit when it comes to selling.

If such an approach had any merit, we would have seen a gradual improvement in the secondary market for New Zealand PhoneCards. The secondary market for these

cards is worse now than at any stage since the Telecom 1994 National Auction.

A sign of a **healthy** market is the number of **buy advertisments** that accompany dealer advertisments. The few remaining dealers show little interest in buying any PhoneCards apart from cards they themseleves have produced and where they have a vested interest in maintaining prices.

Buyers are also being worked over by the employment of very effective packaging strategies. A few dollars spent on cardboard greatly enhances profits of the producer. It will be very interesting to see how well the cardboard functions as an investment enhancer over the long term. There may be good sales of Telecom PhoneCards at the present time, but much of it is based on the misguided belief that big profits lie ahead. The abysmal secondary market suggests that this belief is based on hope rather than any consistent and expansive market growth.

Buyers wishing to make money from Telecom PhoneCards need to be looking back at **early issues** or looking **overseas** at the wider world of phonecards.

If you are a buyer, what are your motives? If you are going to become a collector, great, you are only in it for the fun and a bit of relaxation. If however you are operating on a limited budget, start to think about how you are going to sell the cards in the future.

Ask yourself the following questions about the card:

- 1. Is the card for **general** usage, a positive factor, or produced for gamblers?
- 2. Is the card worthwhile **thematically**? In other words, is it a first or early issue, can it be tied into groups such as Coca-Cola, McDonalds, space, movies, rugby, etc.
- 3. Is the card from a relatively **small** print run? If one is happy about the answers arrived at, on the basis

of the available evidence, go ahead and buy the cards. At the current time, **theme** cards have captured the collectors attention on an international scale. The most vibrant markets are in **Asia**. Speculation has been limited because in many cases cards, whether definitive or advertising, have been issued in numbers that have kept ahead of demand. Quite large collector markets have developed based on good supplies of cheap cards.

The Asian collectors market is focussed on Singapore and it is so strong, that it is attracting major dealers from as far afield as Germany, the USA and Japan.

The Wellington based company **Worldwide Telecard** have become heavily involved in the Asian market as the NZ secondary market has faltered. They report that the best selling cards have a strong thematic appeal and that currently the top selling cards carry the **Coke** logo.

Current collectors, investors, speculators, buyers and hoarders, should be aware of these trends and take them into account when having anything to do with phonecards.

Each month, APM receives a number of recently released, international, phonecards. As from this issue, space permitting, I will reproduce selected cards for the interest of readers.

"STOP IT CHIRAC" PHONECARDS

Global Telecom Distributions Ltd have produced a set of telephone cards for United Nature, an organisation "dedicated to support and protect the Health and Environment of our Planet".

The cards were displayed for the first time at the Press opening of the FIAC art exhibition in the Grand Palais Paris, on the 2nd of October.

The set of ten "Stop it Chirac" cards are a fascinating set indeed, with a number of images depicting various degrees of protest against the atomic testing by the French in the Pacific.

I found one card to be of particular interest, (opposite page top right) as, being an avid collector of 'famous signatures', I was surprised (and pleased) to find that it had been signed by Linford Christie, the current Olympic 100 metres athletics champion. An unusual way indeed to obtain an original of this champion's signature!!

The phone cards themselves can be activated by the transference of funds from a credit card and can be used to make both national and international calls in and from over 40 countries, **including Australia**, from any phone including home, business, hotel, mobile or pay-phone.

Global Telecom will donate a percentage of the line costs to United Nature. Proceeds from the sale of cards also go to United Nature.

AMERITECH PRE-PAID CARD

Ameritech has introduced a new pre-paid telephone card which has some interesting features.

The Chicago based telecommunications company has mailed the new card to about 500,000 households in eight cities in the midwestern United States.

Each household received two "cold" cards - which are valuless until activated - in their monthly telephone bills. Customers activate the cards by charging \$10-\$40 in value from their credit card.

The cards can be re-charged on a continual basis and can be used from touch-phones in the U.S and Canada to call anywhere in the world.

Of interest, is that the two cards are made of laminated cardboard and are attached to the mail out insert. By pressing gently, the cards are 'popped' out from the promotional insert!!

Each of the two cards contain an initial three minutes of free call time.

HAMMERMILL 'REACHES OUT'

Hammermill Papers, Memphis Tennesee, USA, is giving away pre-paid calling cards, each with US\$10.00 worth of long distance calling time, as a company promotion.

After the Hammermill calling cards have had their initial \$10.00 of credit used up, they are able to be 'reloaded' with more time by calling an 1-800 customer service number and charging new time to a credit card. The calling cards are a product of ATS Network Communications Inc., a long distance telephone corporation headquartered in Memphis, Tennesee.

AMERIVOX 'CardEx '95'

The first of the CardEx '95 phonecards has arrived, they being the two issued by **AmeriVox**.

Both are quite attractive and feature subjects highly approriate to the Conference and Exhibition.

Over 50 cards were issued by different telcos for CardEx '95 and these are a sought after item for thematic collectors.

PAPUA NEW GUINEA 'Birds of Paradise'

Featured opposite are the four cards in the PNG Birds of Paradise set, which will have a print run of **only 2000** sets, with no re-prints.

The cards themselves will be widely distributed in PNG as well as being available for the collector market. It will be the lowest quantity of any set printed to date and as such, definately a set (or two) to acquire

For those with an interest in philately, the four cards are identical to a **stamp set** of four issued by PNG in 1991!






FOCUS ON FARAWAY PLACES

This Month: MAURITIUS

Mauritius, former Dutch colony, former French colony, former British colony, is a tiny island nation rapidly being swept away from its colonial past by a latterday economic revolution.

For over a century the economy of this Indian Ocean country was dominated by the sugar industry, which was owned and controlled by a small group of wealthy French landowners. In the past 15 years, however, sugar has lost its premier poition and has been superseded in importance by the massive new textile industry. The abundance of cheap labour combined with farsighted government policies (for example, tax holidays for new businesses) has brought about an amazing economic boom. Severe over-population is a continuing problem though and land prices are well beyond the reach of the average citizen.

I visited Mauritius for the first time in 1977. Like all tourists I was dazzled by the magnificent beaches and coral reefs, impressed by the sensuous se'ga dancing and well pleased with the inexpensive clothing. But I was equally struck by the general poverty, squalor and illiteracy. I saw stray dogs scrounging for scraps in the Port Louis abattoir; I saw bicycle vendors selling chilli cakes at the roadside; I witnessed policemen accepting bribes worth less than a dollar - I was seeing an overcrowed nation struggling for a viable future.

Now the street vendors have all but dissappeared, credit cards are smilingly accepted at even the smallest "tabagie" (Mauritian milkbar cum bottle shop, selling everything except fresh milk!) Kentucky Fried Chicken is killing the traditional chilli cake and everyone seems to be endowed with new found wealth.

Until two or three years ago there were virtually no public telephones in Mauritius; even many homes were without a telephone. Mauritius Telecom has now installed several hundred public telephones which are operated by optical phonecards supplied by Landis & Gyr of Switzerland. Phonecards are available in four values: 10 units, 20 units, 50 units and 120 units.

In Mauritius the cards cost the eqivalent of \$5, \$10, \$25 and \$60. Mauritius Telecom will sell cards by mail order but at a premium of about 20 percent over the local price, plus postage.


My wife, Jo, and I were recently in Sydney to attend the NSW Collectables Fair and the Showgrounds Collectables Fair, and were able to obtain some very attractive 'transport cards' in Sydney and St Marys.

The Monorail Cards

At present, this is a very nice set of five cards, starting with the 8-ride pass through to the 12-ride pass. The hardest card to collect is the newest, the 11-ride pass, and the only way to collect this one is to purchase it at one of the monorail Stations and actually use it.

However, a collectors pack with the 8, 10 and 12-ride passes is available, but the monorail does little to assist in collecting the **whole** set.











My wife and I love Chinese food, so we used the cards to travel from the Holiday Inn Menzies down to Chinatown.

By the way, the Saturday/Sunday Paddy's Market near Chinatown is well worth the visit!

The St Marys Transcard

St Marys is situated some 25 kilometres east of Sydney, near Penrith, and is currently trialling a new smart card as an alternative to cash.

The card can be charged with any amount between \$10.00 and \$200.00 at several Transcard/Wizard Agents in the area and is suitable for use with public transport, taxis and various retailers, eg. McDonald's, Video-Ezy, newsagents and liquor shops.

The card is 'shown' to a 'reader' which displays the card's star balance before and after each transaction.

Light coding displayed by the reader also advises re the cards status - a green light indicates the card has been accepted; a red light advises that the card has expired and a yellow light on bus readers warns that the remaining balance is low!

The card itself has an eye-catching flag-like design, using the three primary colours, red, green and blue (see card on page 37).

The Transcard smart card has a built-in computer chip, which receives, stores and outputs information.

Collecting of the card is not really encoraged, but as it is really a <u>trial issue</u>, users of the card would be wise to hold on to them as a collector's item.




