EDITORIAL

Telstra!!

If anyone did not know that Telstra existed up to a few weeks ago, they certainly will by now with the Federal Election campaign (as this is being written) nearly at its end.

Phonecards!!

What a pity that this particular item of Telstra (Telecom) origin (in this country) could not become a political issue! Some publicity would have been welcome (in my opinion) as, unfortunately, not everyone knows that **they** exist and that **they** are a

collectable, in many forms, to many people both in this country and world wide.

It still surprises me many times, when I enter a newsagency or corner store and ask to look at their stock of phonecards, that I am studied 'warily' when I indicate that I am a collector of these items.

This level of the public are obviously aware that cards are used to 'pay' for phone calls, but many are still umaware that they are a collectable to many people.

When people ask me these days, "what do you do (for a living)", my reply that I edit and publish a magazine immediately places me in the category of a Packer or Murdoch.

However, when pressed to indicate what "the magazine is about", my explanation again (in many cases) brings quizical looks and polite murmers along the lines of "thats nice (I think?)".

The moral of this little anecdote?

Even after six years, since its introduction in late 1989, there is still a public ignorance to the existence of the phonecard and specifically (and importantly) to an awareness to its value to many, both monetory and emotional.

I do not know at what percentage level of the populace this unawarness is, but the obvious answer to injecting a boost to the current 'quiet period' in phonecard collecting, is to both attract an influx of interest and collectors to the hobby, as well as **retain** those that are 'drifting' away.

Such an occurrence would obviously benefit all, dealers, clubs, phonecard producers and existing collectors.

Publicity, we need publicity - based on positive facts! If Babe wins the Academy Award for Best Pig or whatever, if only he/she would accept the Oscar dressed in a fetching little item made from phonecards!

Seriously though, is enough being done to publicise the **positive aspects** of phonecard collecting and is what is being done, being promoted in the right manner and direction?

As I have indicated before, we all have opinions, ie., at every level of the hobby; be it manufacturer, dealer, collector or magazine editor.

Unfortunately, not always are these opinions put forward in a constructive manner, heard and accepted. Unfortunately, opinion is in many cases perceived as criticism and a resentment to such perceived 'opinion' often means that it is not accepted and acted upon.

Feed back is essential to all levels of the industry (which it is) and hobby. Why don't you write to me with your thoughts on what can be done to **publicise** the hobby - by whom and how?

Each month I will publish letter's received, with the 'best one' receiving a collector pack. All letters received will receive a mint phonecard in return, so put pen to paper (or fingers to the keyboard) and let me know your thoughts. Who knows, someone may hear you?

Anonymity of the writer will be preserved in all cases. **Editor**

Card Phone Australia is pleased to announce that it has been granted the exclusive Australian Football League (AFL) phonecard licence for a further year.

David Mohan advises that during the **1996**, **Coca-Cola AFL Season**, Card Phone plan to release a series of phonecards depicting historical aspects of this 100 year old, uniquely Australian sport.

Also, during 1996, Card Phone have decided to include designs, paintings and photographic work by talented Australian artists for both collector and general phonecard releases. (see back cover for works by Paul Sullivan, Peter Hendrie, Mark Solomon and John Banagan).

The Victorian government railways have asked Card Phone Australia to complete installations on all **V/Line trains**. This amounts to 55 country train payphones and approximately 18 station/platform hard-wired payphones. Card Phone Australia have committed to a 12 month installation plan of payphones with the Public Transport Commission (P.T.C.)

David also advises, that shop fitting in **20 Centre Place**, Melbourne, will commence during the month of March. Two or three Cardphones for public use will be installed on the premises.



Featured also in the 'write-up' on Indo-Phonecards '95 (Jakarta, Indonesia) was Card Phone's 'religious' card - printed in the local language.



There will also be a **\$2 Promotional card** produced which will be **available only** in the Limited Issue folder and **will not be** available for individual sale.


This issue will be followed by the 'Atlanta Olympic Games' set. More on these in the next issue of APM.

I have received a copy of the **1st Edition** of Telstra's **Catalogue** of their Phonecards, produced (almost entirely) in **Japanese**, for the Japanese market.

Unfortunately, (in my opinion), the catalogue does **not** depict any of the Custom cards as produced by Telstra, nor many of the Advertising cards - not being able to read Japanese I do not understand the rationale behind this; if in fact there is any.

The Custom and Advertising cards are undoubtably the most attractive of Telstra's Phonecards and their inclusion in a catalogue produced specifically for the Japanese market could only be a positive promotion for Telstra.

I understand also, that the catalogue, 'Collect Australian Phonecards: Official Telstra Catalogue' - written by Graham Bird and Ken Sparks, is also available. This is the fifth edition of this catalogue and it is available from Telstra's Phonecard Collector Service for \$10 plus \$3.50 for postage and handling.

As with past editions, this catalogue has a failing in that it does not contain a complete reproduction of the Telstra Phonecards produced - only those that were/are available from Telstra's Phonecard Collector Service.

As indicated above, again, I cannot understand the seeming reluctance to include all the categories of Phonecards produced by Telstra.

Telstra's 'Phoneaway' Cards

Telstra will soon be announcing a major change to their existing **Phone Australia** cards.







THE GRAPEVINE

My Big Bug Bear!!

On thinking about my concerns in regards to certain aspects of the hobby of phonecard collecting, I have come to the conclusion that most are caused because someone from one area of the hobby gets involved in another area, which can cause a conflict of interest.

Basically, my philosophy is that:

- . Dealers should deal;
- . Collectors should collect;
- . Manufacturers should manufacture;
- Clubs should not become dealers or manufacturers;
- . Magazine Publishers should publish!

What has occurred is that some dealers make telephone cards, some manufacturers deal in the secondary market, some collectors attempt to act as a dealer, some publishers deal, and some publishers manufacture. Some even do more than one of the above!!

All of these situations are not good for the hobby as they produce instability and can cause conflict.

When a **dealer** starts making cards, he is becoming a supplier and a competitor to other dealers with a vested interest in selling his own cards, as opposed to any other cards collected.

When a **collector** pretends to be a dealer by placing large adverts in magazines, other collectors attempting to order possibly cheap cards often get disapointed with poor quality or the comment "no stock available". Also, collectors think the low prices advertised are the market norm when in **actual fact** they are higher.

When manufacturers start to deal in the secondary market, their interests are starting to be diverted from the task of providing a telecommunications service, along to the lines of how to generate income from collectors.

Clubs can be a problem when they become quasi dealers - all for the fine motive of providing a service to their members. The club can undermine the local dealer until it is not profitable for the dealer to supply many lines in his/her shop. The result is that non-club members then do not have a facility to buy those products locally and club members can't find a local dealer to buy their excess stock either! Clubs should support the local infrastructure and pay a few cents extra - but in the meantime 'give some-one a job'. Many clubs in fact, by trading in

so many accessories etc., are liable for taxation penalties and this problem could become serious if the tax department investigated club turnover figures.

When magazine publishers start to trade as a dealer, their advertisers are faced with a difficult problem. I mean, would you as a dealer send your next advert to a competitor before they made their own adverts up?

I think it is time for everyone to look inwards and ask themselves, "am I doing what is best for the hobby?"

Confusion over Circulars

Another concern I have, relates to the current practice employed by some dealers whereby they send out **private circulars** advertising non-Telstra issues, enclosed inside one of **Telstra's Bulletins**.

I believe it is wrong for any dealers to re-send the Telstra Bulletin after including their own advertising material, as this may lead a collector to think that the products on the leaflet included are supported or provided by Telstra.

If you, as a collector, receive any of this material and have ordered phonecards from these circulars on the assumption that they are a Telstra product (and found out they are not), please contact Telstra to make your feelings known. The person to ring is **George Pulciani on (02) 204 0177**.

Un-numbered Phonecards

If any one thinks that the current dangers to the hobby are minimal, I address a further key area of concern.

In the January issue of APM, I expressed my concerns in regards to **quality control**, in respect of 'smaller or unidentifiable' phonecard producers. ie.,

"This problem has already occurred in several countries where serious doubts exist about whether figures quoted for particular mintages are in fact reliable. An un-numbered card is a danger, not a rarity in the present climate from the investment angle". etc. (see page 30, January '96 APM).

More examples of 'countries' and 'companies' producing both un-encoded and un-numbered phonecards for the collector market, are emerging each month.

Concern and warnings are being expressed by phonecard magazine editors in regards to this practice, that is, warning that un-encoded cards are being sold as encoded and also warning that stated print runs as promoted by card producers should be treated (in some cases) with caution.

Both collectors and dealers are expressing concern with regard to having confidence in a phonecard issue produced under a process which cannot confirm the two points raised above.

The **collector** is proving wary of outlaying (in some cases considerable) funds to purchase a card which may be no more than a 'piece of plastic or cardboard, whilst the **dealer** is not going to stock such material, nor **importantly**, buy it 'back' from a collector in the secondary market!

Having numbered cards does not stop a bogus company printing extra cards, but the chance of duplicates appearing and thereby 'blowing the cover' of a possible 'racket' is a deterrent to activity in this area.

The issue of encoding is harder to confirm, especially when dealing with cards produced for international usage. It is only by 'knowing' and 'trusting' the company you deal with - through their past performance - that you can feel confident in the product you purchase.

Logically, a statement indicating cards numbered (a) to (b) with a specific design, have been encoded for use in a specific country and/or system, accompanying each issue would provide a measure of confidence in the product.

Chip Cards

Whilst Telstra continues to explore the logistics of a conversion from its present Tamura type cards to chip cards, there has been no clear indication of a time frame for such a conversion.

It is to be hoped that whenever a conversion is to take place, **ample warning** will be given to all involved in the hobby.

CZECH REPUBLIC

The following article has been provided by Veronica Roche from Scotia Phonecards in Scotland.

Following the interest (and confusion) created by Competition No. 4 in the December, January and February issues of APM, Veronica provided this article in an attempt to clarify the situation.

It contains some interesting aspects, particularly in regards to the issue of City Cards; cards which until now, I thought were phonecards only.

According to dealers, the City Cards have proven popular, which augers well for the issue of our own Australian multi purpose cards.

Ceskoslovensko was known as 'The Heart of the Roman Empire', and its **Celtic origins** go back as far as a thousand years. As time went by, people were dispersed further and further away until eventually they settled in countries like Ireland and Scotland.

Prague (Praha) is the capital and was the first medieval metropolis in Central Europe.

Czechoslovakia in the '80s

My first visit to Czechoslovakia was in the mid 1980s when it was still a Communist State. Russian was still the compulsory 'other' language taught in schools and very few people could understand English.

The currency was **Korun** (Kc) and exchange rates varied from 12Kc per £ (official rate) to 100Kc per £ (black market rate)! The choice of goods in the shops was very limited

All was to change as the 1980s came to a close. In line with the other Eastern Block countries, Czechoslovakia had its own 'Velvet Revolution' and the Communist era came to an end.

A well known 'underground' literary figure, Vaclav Havel, was elected President and startling changes began to take place. Due to pressure from the Slovak population, at the end of 1992, Czechoslovakia ceased to exist and became two independant counries, The Czech Republic and Slovakia. Vaclav Havel continued as the president of The Czech Republic.

During 1993, the Czech Republic started to catch up with the west. People began to learn to speak English, mainly in the major cities as a result of the increasing tourism industry.

The currency is still the Korun (Kc) but the rather drab notes from the Communist era have been replaced with a new look.

There is a very efficient Metro in Prague, art galleries, St Vitas Cathedral, The National Theatre, Bohemian porcelain, Czech Crystal and wonderful friendly people.

Today you see advertising everywhere. The trams in Prague and Brno are now colourful instead of the drab cream and red of the 70s and 80s.

Up until a few years ago, stamp collecting was perhaps the major hobby and collections were passed down through the generations.

Phonecards Appear in 1991

When telephone cards appeared in 1991, it did not take long for a group of mainly 'ex' stamp collectors to set up a **club** for phonecards.

This club was called K.S.T., and met fortnightly in Prague. Now the club has an international membership, holds weekly 'bourses' in the YMCA and promotes the hobby through regular newletters and fairs.

With an estimated <u>90 million people</u> visiting Prague each year, the cardphones are constantly in use. You will rarely find a used phonecard however, since local collectors appear from nowhere to take possession of a card within seconds of it being left in the phone booth.

It's worth checking rubbish bins close to cardphones though, provided you don't mind rummaging through discarded McDonalds containers!

Phonecards are issued by SPT Telecom Prague - Schlumberer & Gemplus Chip - Reverse Printing.

A nice thing about Czech phonecards is that they don't produce too many issues and most are at a reasonable price.

The first issue of phonecards was in 1991 and a number of the early issues are noteworthy for their very short print runs.

Popular Issues

Some of the more visible cards (as stocked by dealers) include those which depict a number of 'western' pop groups and stars.

They have become very popular to fans and music lovers worldwide and include:-

Queen (100,000 issued),




Europa - Jackson + U2 (1000 issued), Europa - Jackson (1000 issued), Phil Collins (50,000 issued '93) - see opposite page -

and Paul McCartney (100,000 issued '94).



In December 1993, the cost of phonecards doubled overnight at retailers in the Czech Republic.

Some of the 1994 issues depicted Dinosaurs - see page 29 - the Cesky Olympics, Apollo 11, Paul Gaughin (Art Gallery), K2 (Himalayas) and a Penthouse issue in November. Finally in December, we had a painting of a group of Ape men - see page 29.

A notable issue in June, to commemorate the 50th D Day celebrations, featured black and white photos on three cards of which 50,000 of each were issued. In March 1995, the Black Perelli arrived - *see page* 29 - whilst in April, three cards were issued to commemorate the 50th Anniversary of the end of World War II. The cards depicted black and white photos from that time.

Czech City Cards

These cards are attractive and highly collectable multi-purpose chip cards, issued by New TeleLine, a private independent company.

Used extensively throughout the major cities in the Czech Republic, they can be used as a phonecard on private sites, to purchase consumables from specially equipped vending machines, to pay parking charges and to purchase tickets for travel on the Prague Metro.

Notable City Cards issued include:-Coca Cola Vending Machine - 5000 issued

Railway Cards

The Czech Railway has issued a number of attractive and collectable Railway chip cards depicting steam trains. They are only available at main railway stations in The Czech Republic.

Used only to purchase travel around the country, you insert the Railway Card into the ticket vendinmg machine and chose your destination (charged by the kilometre). The cost of your travel is deducted from the card and a ticket is issued.

Both City Cards and Railway Cards are issued by the same company.

Slovakia

The currency of this country is also the Korun (Kc) but the exchange rate is different to the Czech Republic, as the economy is not as strong.

Cards issued by Slovak Telecom Bratislava, initially with Schlumberger chip, are now manufactured by G.P.T.

The first cards were issued in **1992**, with four issues in **1993** and a further eleven issues in **1994**. Further issues have taken place since then.

PHONECARD COLLECTING IN BRAZIL

A Report by John Kruger

The following extracts are from the "Jornal Eero Hora", the newspaper of Porto Alegre, population 2.1 million, 1200 kilometres from Rio De Janeiro.

Published September 9, 1995

Sr. Sergio Lucena, a business man from Rio Grande in Brazil, began his collection about six years ago when he was living in the French city of Lyon. He bought one of the first issues of **France Telecom** purely as a souvenir, but as more designs were released, so his collection grew.

Having returned to Brazil two years ago, his collection now numbers more than 600 cards, with the most valuable being a **Mozart** commemorative card, valued at US\$200.

Sr. Romulo Tardivo, a coin and stamp dealer of fifteen years, closes his Porto Alegro shop every weekend and goes hunting for phonecards which are now making up the majority of his business.

"Phonecard collecting is the 'new' hobby", he said, "with the collectors leaving banknotes, coins and stamps, in favour of these new and colourful phonecards". "In the last few months, this new hobby has exploded and the cards from **Telebras** are in great demand".

Sr. Tardivo said he is determined to collect all issues of Telebras, but this is proving to be difficult, as some limited editions are very elusive, especially the card depicting Brazillian soccer star **Romario**, which is in great demand and is very high in price, being a limited edition **1000 unit** card.

Fellow Porto Allegre dealer, **Sr. Arturo Parckerd**, attended a coin and stamp Expo in Rio De Janeiro and found the main topic of conversation among dealers there was the phenomenon of 'phonecard collecting'.

Recognising the potential of phonecards, he purchased a quantity of cards, including one copy of the **Rosario** card, for which he paid 900 Real (pronounced re-arl), which is approx. US\$920!! His business currently records R\$23 million to R\$3 million per month, in phonecard sales alone!!

Coin and stamp dealer, **Sr. Paulo Junges**, said that he is receiving letters from as far away as Sao Paulo and Rio De Janeiro, from collectors wishing to buy the limited edition card issued to commemorate the **'Copa America'** soccer tournament played some months ago in Uruguay.

He bought only two cards for stock as the price was very high and under the strict control of Telebras.

"If Telebras does not increase card production, the value of cards will remain very high. It is now much easier to buy foreign cards rather than the local issues", he said.

A spokesperson for Telecom Brazil (Telebras), has stated that **9 million cards are no-where near enough** to satisfy the demand of customers and collectors alike - **for just one month**!!

(This is not so surprising, given that Rio now has 10 million inhabitants and Sao Paulo is listed as the fourth largest inland city in the World).

"The huge demand for phonecards has created a speculative market, with many cards selling for more than their face value.

In order to curb this speculation, Telebras will shortly be **increasing** production to **20 million** cards per **month**", he said.

Phonecards were first introduced by Telebras in March 1992, with the first issue being for the World Conference on Pollution - ECO '92 - held in Rio, and depicting the *Vitoria-Regia*, an endangered giant lillypad, found only on the Amazon River.

This card was re-issued in 1993, for the benefit of collectors to augment their collections. The re-issue is recognisable by the addition of the logo in the bottom left corner.



Thematic collectors have been well catered for, with every conceivable subject being covered, with the notable exceptions being the very popular Coca-Cola and the up and coming McDonalds.

Two of the latest issues are the very colourful fish series and the beautiful display of orchids.

Brazillian phonecards are designated in units as follows:-

10 units - R\$ 0.30; 20 units - R\$ 0.60; 50 units - R\$ 1.50; 100 units - R\$ 3.00;

400 units - R\$12.00; 800 units - R\$24.00.

There is also the **very limited edition** card of 1000 units - R\$36.00.

New denominations of 25; 75 and 90 units will be introduced with increase in production early in 1996.

I do not think that there would be much left of your insides if the elephant made a 'boo boo' and stepped on you. At the same park, the elephants will pick you up off the ground in their trunks.

Further out from Bangkok it is possible to still see elephants working and even meet them coming down the road. A novelty to the visitor, but the locals do not even bother to look.

The first official phonecard collector's club in Australia, the Australian Phonecard Collectors Club Inc., based in Adelaide, recently celebrated their 5th Birthday.

A social evening was held to mark the occasion on Monday, the 22nd of January, 1996. A most enjoyable, relaxed, evening was held at the Toc-H-Hall where the Club holds its monthly meetings. Many members took advantage of the free trading table offer.

Guest speakers were Ted Coomans, General Manager of Telstra Payphone Services SA/NT/WA, founding President, Leo Strubbe and current President, Ted Hymers.

Phonecard came to Adelaide in May 1990, after the Geelong trials. 270 payphones were installed in Adelaide areas in the first two weeks. A further 500 were installed in November 1990. Deemed a success, they were then installed in other states.

Shortly after this, some stamp club members got together and approached Telecom (as it was then) for assistance to form a Phonecard club. This resulted in the first A.P.C.C. being formed at an inaugural meeting on 22nd January, 1991.

Seven interested collectors were present at this meeting at the home of founding President, Leo Strubbe. Five of these are still financial members and four remain committee members; Leo, the Hymers family - Ted, Glenis and daughter Briony.

The eldest daughter, Kerrie, now residing in Victoria, was greatly involved in much of the ground work, being the Club's first secretary. Briony was responsible for work on the Club logo, eventually designed by graphic design student, David Charlton of Ballarat of Victoria.

The **first committee**, led by Leo, was most insistent and persuasive in getting help from Telecom. Numerous meetings involving people from Adelaide and Sydney, including at that time Ted Coomans, Sue Bailey, Marie Suzuki and Nelda Slezak. Both Marie and Nelda have attended past AGMs as Guest Speakers.

The Club's third meeting was transferred to the Toc-H-Hall in Edwardstown as membership increased and this has been the meeting venue ever since.

Membership increased to 180 in the first year and over the five year period has remained stable.

Within two years, a total of 280 financial members were enrolled. However, there has been a decline over the last year or two, due largely to other clubs being formed in most states and members joining their 'local' club. The A.P.C.C. however, still remains the largest club in Australia with in excess of 200 members.

In September 1992, the Club produced the **first phonecard catalogue** in Australia - **Phonecards of Australia** - which was a very popular publication both in this country and overseas. A **second** and a **third Edition** were published in September '92 and January '94 respectively. The catalogue has now been discontinued, due to huge printing costs, in particular the production of card photos.

In July '95, a serial **Numbers List Catalogue** was produced, featuring all Phonecards produced by Telstra. This has also proven popular.

Club Promotional Cards have also been produced. The <u>first</u> was released for the Club's first Fair on 27 November '93 and featured the design of the SA \$10 Kangaroo Island Phonecard.





The <u>second</u> card, the Club's own design, featured Adelaide's tourist train Steam Ranger-Southern Encounter, which commutes tourists from Adelaide to Goolwa and Victor Harbour.

These two cards were produced as fund raisers and proved a resounding success.

An excellent bi-monthly magazine has continued to be published, containing 16 to 20 pages each issue and containing the latest information on phonecard collecting. This publication is sought after by State Libraries and overseas' clubs and collectors.

What is the future of the phonecard and consequently phonecard collector clubs?

We are sure they are both here to stay. It would seem that the present Phonecard will change its format into a smart card, but that people will still collect cards in their new format as well as the magnetic cards that commenced their issue with Telecom in 1989.

Clubs will continue to function and to promote this wonderful hobby in all aspects.

Over the next few months, members will receive in their newsletters some details of competitions to be held by the Club, with feature displays utilising a display board with good security.


