





YDNEY based designer Sophie Zhang has been commissioned by ComCard Pacific to design their two Nauru custom cards depicting the Year of the Rat 1996

Sophie is no new comer to designing phonecards. Her 1994 Year of The Dog won high acclaim and was chosen by Telstra as their phonecard for that year.

Sophie also designed The Year of The Pig in 1995 for Harbour City Stamps and Phonecards. This year she came second in the Telstra competition for designing Year of The Rat.

Born in China, Sophie is a graduate from NanJing Academy of Fine Arts. After she graduated in 1987 she was employed by the Chinese Department of Hygiene as a graphic artist, illustrating many national health campaigns.

Arriving in Australia in the late 80's, life was not easy. Sophie worked in a factory in Parramatta while trying to find employment best suited to her talents.

However, Sophie believed luck was always on her side as she was born during Chinese New Year.

After perseverance she managed to secure a position with Sydney's Chinese Herald as a designer. After several years



Sophie took the plunge and decided to set herself up as a freelance artist, and from all reports, work is coming in at a rapid pace.

Her work is now being admired by collectors and non-collectors, not only



here in Australia but from overseas collectors as well.

"I came to Australia to make design my profession. I wanted to blend Eastern and Western styles of Art," she said.



Ms Sayer said that "Telstra is absolutely delighted with the response from the Chinese community to this design competition.

"The results will allow us to use the simplest cross culture language, art, to draw

the attention of all phonecard users to the richness of Chinese culture," she said.

USTRALIA DAY, celebrated on the 26th of January is Australia's national day. This year's Australia Day Telstra phonecard features Australian youth enjoying themselves on the beach, playing volleyball, which is a sport that has recently experienced rapid growth in popularity. The cards will be available in Limited Edition folder and there will be 6,000 folders produced.

Sydney Stamp Centre have been appointed a Collector selling Agent for Australia's latest Phonecards company, EZI Phonecall Australia. Koalas and Sydney Opera House are the first two releases with a \$50.00 Kangaroo to follow. Also they have been appointed the selling agent for New Zealand Global Phonecards scenery and rugby are the inital topics.

APTAIN Munchies has always maintained a high profile with innovative marketing ideas and strategies, currently advertising on TV and the Cinema "Eat at Captain Munchies and win a fabulous collectable phonecard". This campaign is planned to run for the next 12 months with the second phonecard issue in the series already in the pipeline.

On Sunday 12th the sun shone brightly on the Western Australia Port City of Fremantle and the Phonecard Collectors Swap Meet at Captain

Munchies was a huge success.

A Ferris Wheel, Air Castle and Coca-Cola Fire Engine giving Free rides and drinks added a carnival flavour to the atmosphere created by the bunting and Coke umbrellas.

From a stage made of milk crates, Captain Munchie (himself) Lionel Richards welcomed everyone and showed the phonecard in its souvenir pack. He explained the format of the competition and introduced Mark Howells from Telstra Payphone Services who drew names from the entry box for a whole range of prizes including 3 limited edition packs donated by Telstra, 25 Captain Munchies Souvenir Packs, an Indian Motorcycle pack donated by Cowley Motorcycles & Collectables, an assortment of Telstra, Coca-Cola, Fruitopia and Captain Munchies T-shirts, Local and Overseas phonecard publications, plus pens, rulers and balloons for all the kids. Mark was also thanked (and applauded by all present) for locating a new Telstra phonecard express payphone at Captain Munchies.

Two local dealers attended, Ron Moss from The Great Aussie Phone-card Co. with wife and kids, and Ian Grimson of Westland Stamps & Phonecards. There were lots of family groups and individual collectors trading phonecards among

themselves and the dealers.

George Crafer, President of the Perth Phonecard Collectors Group then took to the stage with Lionel Richards on the mike and 6 year old daughter Amy Richards holding the box they drew more winners

Interestingly 5 of the 25 winners were from interstate, three had mailed \$5 for a food voucher to get their names in the draw, and two where locals had gone to Captain Munchies to enter the draw at the insistence of their friends interstate. 11 of the 25 Souvenir pack winners were present at the drawing to collect their prizes.

Lionel Richards pointed out a spelling error in the packs and announced that there were new improved packs being printed and expected by next week but all chose to take the faulty pack today (which may become more valuable) rather than wait for the reprint.

A lot of other people were attracted by the Free Rides, and the "what's all the action over there — let's go check it out" many of whom got into conversations about the agony and the ecstasy

of phonecard and thematic collecting and future directions of the hobby.

There were literally thousands of passers by drawn by a Motorcycle Show 500 meters away in the Inter-national Passenger Terminal, a Telstra Community Open Day in the near-Telephone bv Exchange and a myriad of other Festival of Fremantle fun activities including a Parade just down the road.

There were 10,000 Captain Munchies Custom Phonecards issued in August 1995. For obvious reasons it has proven to be very popular with Coca-Cola collectors in Australia and Overseas, and in just 3 months nearly half have been sold.

Smart card on trial

MART cards, or more specifically Stored Value Cards began trial last month on Queensland's Gold Coast.

The Store Value Cards are designed as a replacement for small cash transactions such as phone calls, groceries, parking, soft drinks, fast food and petrol.

The Gold Coast pilot is the largest stored value card pilot in Australia and one of the largest in the world, building up to involving more than 1,000 merchants with more than 150,000 cards being issued to potential customers.

Major institutions such as the ANZ, Westpac, Commonwealth and National banks together with CUSCAL (representing credit unions Australia wide) commenced issuing VISA Cash cards last month to their customers to use in various outlets.

The cards used in the pilot trial will be disposable cards however, Hilton Sack, Executive Vice President of Visa International, Australia and New Zealand, said anonymous disposible VISA Cash will continue to be issued after Visa launches reloadable cards early next year, because there is a substantial long term market for both.

"Independent market research has shown that people want both types of cards, with Australian research showing a quarter of consumers wanting disposable cards," he said.

The Federal Attorney General and Member for Dickson, in the state of Queensland, the Hon Michael Lavarch officially opened the launch and was first

to use the Smart Card in several outlets.

"We encourage the development of creative solutions to issues such as privacy and endeavour to maximise the new job opportunities that will flow from such innovations," he said.

Participating members of the VISA Cash programme have agreed to adopt a set of privacy principles which will operate in addition to the existing codes of practice under which financial institution currently operate.

Sydney View

S the year draws to a close lets look back at the year in regards to Phonecards. To be honest, it has been something of a confusing year to draw too many conclusions on. In some respects, it's been good and in other respects it has been a bit weak.

After all, the year really started with a bang. If we look at the first few months of the year we can see that there was certainly no shortage of products being released.

Everything from the colourful Summertime cards, through to the pricey and eventually disastrous Australia" issue. To put it mildly, collectors were shell-shocked, many dealers reported their standing order customers dropped by as much as 70%. Indeed, looking at the subsequent fall-out from many of these issues, ie custom cards, where eventually being sold through ordinary outlets for Phonecalls. Although having said that, the interesting thing is that many collectors who previously did not collect custom cards have got a "taste" for custom cards because they have been able to buy them a cheaper. Also, once this excess of stock is "used up", so to speak, the excess will be gone, stranger things have happened. Maybe some of these cards that seem to be everywhere at the moment may actually end up being scarce.

That was the custom card side of things. We also had the Telstra side where they found that 8,500 of a limited Edition collector pack is not really limited at all. In fact, as it stands, I think you can still get all of the 1995 Limited Edition packs from Telstra. Certainly a far cry from the 1994 situation where packs were a sell-out before being released and you had the crazy situation where people were in fact "futures trading" on packs like the 1994 Endangered Species and the Commonwealth Games packs. These packs were released in a way that allowed people to buy up to five of each.

Of course, if your brother or your wife etc also "collected phonecards" they could also be on the list and get five packs as well. For sometime it was, as Arthur from the hit television series "Minder" would have said "it's a good earner". Today the party is well and truly over and you can buy these aforementioned packs for not much over the issue price, if at all.

What this all must show plainly and clearly, at least to Telstra, is that they have to reduce again their Limited Edition packs and at the same time take a close look at their mailing list to see if, when they do reduce numbers, they don't have the same thing happening again, that is, undue speculation.

Talking to people in the market, I would think a number say around 4,000 would be a good number. Even if it's a bit low, great, it would get some interest happening again in the collectors edi-

tions. After all, the fact is, Telstra has conceded that you can make a custom card in quantities as low as 2,500.

However, enough of the collectors packs. As the year dragged on, the issuing of custom cards first started to slow and now in December it has come to a grinding halt. In fact, if you look at the custom cards that have come out since say even June, the number is quite low.

However, Telstra seems to have more than picked up the slack with the amount of advertising and special category cards they are releasing. Who knows what, some of these cards may actually end up being okay. Sets like the Beijing Opera and some of the Austel cards are even issued in quite low category. There is little doubt that at least one of the cards that has been issued in the past few months will end up being quite good.

Another sleeper may be the greetings card issues. Early reports suggest that this idea may not meet with great success. Indeed, New Zealand Telecom seems to have abandoned its series of greetings cards, Phonecards. So as a result if they are *not* successful, they may actually become scarce down the track, this collecting can get a bit weird at times!

The year in Sydney has ended on a reasonable note as far as fairs go. The November fair seemed to leave most dealers reasonably happy. In fact, a funny thing was, a couple of dealers reported that their takings was not much different to what they were back in March, when it would be fair to say, the crowds were certainly larger. Yet despite the smaller crowds the people that were there were spending. Which after all, at least in part, is what it's all about.

However, it does make you think, if crowds are down, what would it take to get them back through the door. One of the suggestions is, that there are too many fairs in Sydney, or wherever for that matter. Melbourne is also well served for fairs. Maybe what's needed is for there to be maybe one or two major fairs a year, and that Telstra, the clubs and the trade all get behind them and turn the fairs into happenings rather than just other shows.

After all, Telstra seems happy to release cards for shows overseas, why don't they release one for a show here. An idea would be to have a fair, say Melbourne one weekend, then Sydney the next and Brisbane the week after, or however it was organised.

Then have a special card and folder to promote the fairs. This item would only be available at these fairs. It might seems a bit artificial but it would work, in so far as it would get people through the door and get an atmosphere going at these fairs again.

Rumour has it that there are people trying to promote an idea to have a major International Phonecard Fair next year (1996) at Sydney's Darling Harbour or somewhere like that. One hopes that this

with Opera House

comes off. Apparently, this show will be tacked on the week after one of the big fairs in Asia, so that the overseas dealers can tack on an extra week to their itinerary and include the Australian fair.

This would be the perfect vehicle for Telstra to do just what I suggested above and issue a special card that would only be available at this show. Lets hope it comes off

While on the subject of overseas shows, it appears that Telstra has pulled a rabbit out of the hat, as far as the show in Jakarta is concerned. As many of you are no doubt aware, Telstra decided to release a special card for this show, as usual in the folder style. It appears there will only be 2,000 odd folders. No doubt, they will end up being sought after. However, as soon as two days before the fair I am sure most of the trade were unaware that any card was to be released at this show. This is a shame, because if the trade had known, it might have made for a slightly better contingent of local dealers at the show. In any case Telstra is to be congratulated for its initiative in deciding to attend this show, because there is little doubt that Indonesia is a huge market waiting to be tapped.

No doubt, Telstra will be able to sell a large range of their product. Which brings us to a small rumour circulating around the trade at present. Rumour has it, that Telstra has floated the idea of selling used cards at some of these overseas shows, no doubt this is just scuttlebutt, because we would certainly hope it was not true. Telstra after all is a Phone company that sells Phonecards for use and for collectors, not a re-seller of used cards on the secondary market.

In the past I have given a tip of the month, and without wishing to be too immodest, many of these have been a reasonable punt.

However, picking one this month is not so easy. Although one keeps coming back to the early material like the Canberra and New South Wales cards and so on, be they mint or used, many feel these cards have fallen far enough in value, certainly the stock is not out there to any large degree.

So maybe that is the tip of the month the cards from these two series. Don't forget to shop around, though it's amazing just what price variations you will find. However with price variations check condition as well. As an example, a \$20 New South Wales Zoo Entrance in good used condition, is worth around \$20 or so. However, a scratched one, what is that worth, \$5 or \$10 or what? The thing for the collector is to combine value with quality and believe me with some of these early issues getting cards in good condition is not that easy.



Bass Strait shipping — a history

IN 1883, John Pascoe Fawnker and John Batman, with the Port Phillip Association, outfitted an expedition from Launceston (Tasmania, then Van Diemans Land) that resulted in the founding of Melbourne, Australia and the land boom in Victoria.

Bass Strait crossing followed in shipping which at that time comprised a variety of sailing ships from small (50tons) ketches to large (2,000 tons) 4-masted barques. Steam powered ships (sailing ships with steam driven paddles) were introduced to Bass Strait in 1840 by the Launceston-Melbourne Steam Navigation Company (later to be taken over by the Tasmanian Steam Navigation Company in 1856). Initially, these vessels were concerned primarily with freight transport between Tasmania and the mainland and accommodated only 20-80 passengers in quite primitive conditions.

In 1851, the "City of Melbourne" of 139 tons was launched in Melbourne. This was Australia's first screw steamer and was built of wood on the banks of the Yarra river. She was affectionately know as "The Screw". However, the introduction in 1904 of the "Loongana", with accommodation for 400 passengers and and deck space of



12 cars and speed (21 knots), the Strait service was dramatically improved.

The "Loongana: was the first turbine-driven steamer to operate in Australian waters, and performed faultlessly for 31 years. She was replaced by "Nairana" and the "Taroona" in 1935 both of which operated until 1959 when they were replaced by the first of the roll-on/roll-off car femes — Australian National Line's "Princess of Tasmania" and "Empress of Australia", both Australian-built.

In 1985 the Tasmanian Government, operating under the trading name "TT Line" purchased the well-know "Abel Tasman" providing accommodation for 919 passengers and 235 cars. TT Line

replaced the "Abel Tasman" with the impressive "Spirit of Tasmania" in 1994.

This magnificent vessel of 31,000 tonnes provides accommodation for 1,300 passengers and 550 cars. Passenger facilities included several restaurants, shops, swimming pool, sauna and casino and a bank of PayTel payphone.

PayTel Australia is celebrating the history of Bass Strait by releasing three phonecards under Bass Strait Shipping — an Australian Maritime Series" showing three original paintings depicting Bass Strait Shipping form 1850 to 1996. The \$5.00 cards shows the "Princess of Tasmania", the \$10 cards shows a 4-masted iron Barque and the \$20 cards shows the TSS "Loongana".

The Ghost who walks, now talks

THE Phantom is the world's oldest superhero. He predates Superman by about three months. The difference being that Superman (Batman et al) are comic book heroes whilst the Phantom is a comic-strip hero, existing only in syndicated newspaper strips.

The comic-books that are published here in Australia are collections of strips that originally appeared in American newspapers — with exception of the occasional Swedish story. Semic, a Swedish publisher, began commissioning original Phantom stories in the late 50's to keep up with



their hectic schedule of weekly Phantom comic books. FREW, the Australian publisher, sometimes reprints these stories. FREW has also produced three of its

own original stories. All written by FREW's owner and direct, Jim Shepherd and illustrated by the late Keith Chatto.

A fourth story, illustrated by Glen Ford is due out early next year.

Semic are still the leading publishers of the Phantom in the world, with a circulation of approx 90,000 through-Scandinavia, Russia and Czechoslovika. FREW has a circulation of approx 50,000, more impressively in only two countries - Australia and New Zealand.

The Phantom is published in South America, Italy, Spain, India and Thailand.

As the circulation of the Australian comic indicates, there are a lot of Phantom fans in this country. Phantom collectables are met with ravenous enthusiasm. The comic themselves, as back issues command huge prices. A No 1 issue sold at auction for \$3,500.00 in fine to near-mint condition. Other collectables, such as rings, badges, 70's paperback novels, 60's board games and model kits are in constant demand.

In June 1993 Dynamic Marketing, in conjunction with Phantom Zone introduced the world's first Phantom Trading Card series. Distributed only in Australia and New Zealand they were an instant success and sold out within a few months

The second series released a year later and produced in larger quantities sold out quickly as well.

The Phantom Zone, in collaboration with Fantasy Phonecards have released their first Phantom Phonecard and indications are that this will snapped-up by Phantom collectors just as quickly.

A Phantom phonecard was produced in Germany a few years ago and now fetches \$100 loose.

The Phonecard is packaged with a two page comic-book written and illustrated by Glenn Ford. Glenn is the official Australian Phantom artist. He designed the two trading series for Dynamic Marketing as well as Phantom T-Shirts, posters, diaries, neckties and covers for the comic. Each phonecard package will be numbered and signed by Glen.

There are no looses cards, therefore the card can only be purchased in package format.

Fundamentals ... for beginners

VER the past year we have looked at various areas of collecting. From joining clubs to exchanging cards and on to the correct storage of your cards. Early on we touched on, but did not expand on the different ways of collecting.

Many people, of course just concentrate on the one country, Australia, for example, and try and complete that. However, there is a growing band of collectors, who instead of collecting by country, collect by Theme or topic.

In doing this, they try and collect one of each card of a particular theme rather than a particular country.

There are many examples of this from trains, planes, cars, flowers — or a particular flower and so on. In the world of phonecard collecting there are probably two major themes that attract peoples interest and behind this there is probably half a dozen or so slightly less popular themes.

However, top of the list would have to be the Coca Cola theme cards.

For a number of years this area has been one of the most popular areas in the world of phonecards. Anybody who takes a look through this or any other phonecard magazine will see lists of Cocoa Cola cards prevailing. The reason for this can be attributed to one or two things.

One, is the collection of Coke memorabilia. An example of this is the fact that Coca Cola Australia has just opened a museum at Sydney's Circular Quay that is wholly dedicated to Cocoa Cola memorabilia. Its stands to reason that one can see that there is a good market for this style of material.

It has been reported, that a catalogue is being produced, which will list all the phonecards that have been produced from all over the world.

So, if a collector was looking for an area to specialise in, this catalogue would be a good use, providing that it was up-dated on a regular basis.

However, it is fair to say, that in general, Coca Cola cards are not that cheap and generally don't sell for much less than 20 or so dollars a card, and can run into \$100's of dollars at times.

The first thing that needs to be spelt out with Coke cards, is the various categories of cards that exist. Recently, there have been articles written on this area that seems to have left this important piece of information. Basically,





you can break the cards down into four categories.

Firstly, the Coca Cola Bottlers — cards that are actually produced by the Coca Cola Company itself to advertise their drink (see pic 1).

Secondly, is the custom cards (see pic 2) — cards that are produced by people who have obtained the license rights for the Coca Cola logo for use on the cards.

Thirdly, is is Coca Cola sponsorship — cards that are issue by an organisation or event that has

Lastly there are, what is commonly known as "incidental" Coke cards, (See pic 4) — cards that picture a scene that happens to picture a billboard or something similar, that features the Coke logo.

Because there are many Coke cards in the market place, a collector may want to break down Coke cards into categories they want to collect.

For example, Coca Cola Bottlers cards and Licensed Product cards or whatever. Some of course, may want to collect every card that has a Coca Cola featured on it.

The decision is up to the individual. However, a good place top start is to purchase the Australian Coke cards.

These sell for around \$50 to \$60 a set. So for a couple of hundred dollars you can get yourself off to a good start with the Australian issue and then maybe look at the overseas cards, which is indeed what has happened to many collectors.

One of the big growth areas for Coca Cola is in the USA. Coke cards and card collecting, in the USA, is in its infant stage at present. As a result

the number of single cards being produced in the States is around the level of 2,500 to 4,000 cards.

Now, if a collector in the States, starts collecting Coke card these small numbers of print runs are going to seem incredibly small for a market the size of the States. The good thing about cards from the USA, is that in many cases you can pick up cards for not much more than the face value, which of course keeps the price down.

We have illustrated a couple of the latest cards from the USA that have proved to be popular. (See pic 5 & 6)
